CANADIAN WHO WAS IN THIBET

Lieut. Hay Mitchell, Formerly of Canadian Force in South Africa, Now of Indian Army, on Furlough--Tells of Experiences he Went Through.

MONTREAL, April 11.—Lieut. Hay Mitchell, now of the Thirty-Second Sikh Pioneers, the only Canadian who went through the Tibetan expedition under Col. Younghusband, is back in Montreal enjoying his eight month's furlough, of which about five will be spent in this city. He arrived at midnight Saturday, and is now staying with his family at the Marlborough.

Lieut. Mitchell who, being in the Indian Army, is still two years short of the captaincy which he would already have secured in the British, where there is no duplicate staff of native officers of any rank. The finest types that could be found of the young officers of His Majesty's service. Big, reserved and good-natured, he is in almost every respect the counterpart of the best English military man, but with a certain added perceptiveness, a keenness of apprehension, that is usually kept in abeyance under a mask of carelessness, but can in an instant be brought into action by anything calling for real attention. He has the English military air that suggests that all things are of no real importance, and underneath it a perpetual suggestion of the alertness that is continually on the watch for something that is of importance.

Lieut. Mitchell did not get to Lhasa, which is a source of very deep regret to him for he found the Tibetan country full of interest. He was wounded in an attack on a "jong" or fort below Gyangsi, and remained there about half-way between the frontier and the forbidden city, while Col. Younghusband and the main force went on. His wound was in the leg, and was infected by one of the matchlock guns of ancient pattern made by the Tibetans themselves; a serious enough affair at the time, but he is now entirely recovered and in the best of health.

"They are the dirtiest people in the world," he said, speaking of the Tibetans. "They never wash, and they never destroy life of any kind, being convinced that any insect may contain the soul of a lately deceased parent. They are inveterate trusters, and they made so much money out of the expedition that they are getting quite reconciled to foreign intercourse,—the people themselves, that

is the lamae, were our real opponents; the people would not have done fighting to speak of if they had not been compelled to by their religious leaders. They are fearfully superstitious.

Lieut. Mitchell gave a most interesting account of the difficulties of the campaign on this enormous plateau—the majority of its surface higher than the top of Mont Blanc on which the winds are so keen and continuous in winter that after three days' march not a man on the expedition had any skin left on his nose. He was enthusiastic in praise of Col. Younghusband, who, he said, made an excellent impression on the natives under the circumstances. The expedition was magnificently organized and equipped, and in spite of the terrific change of climate involved, the men suffered very little.

WILL NOT RACE THE SHAMROCK III

BOSTON, April 13.—From time to time reports and rumors have been going the rounds to the effect that Sir Thomas Lipton had given orders to fit out the Shamrock III and with Captain Charles Bevis in charge, together with an American crew. The latest challenger would take part in the race for the King's cup of Newport during the coming summer. In order to get at the facts a cablegram was sent to the Herald's Clyde correspondent, who by the way, was recently offered the position of secretary to Sir Thomas, instructing him to ascertain the facts in the matter.

His reply by cable is as follows:—
"Glasgow, April 3, 1906.
"That the Shamrock III, will be fitted out to race for the King's cup is most unlikely. Sir Thomas could not now hire a first-class skipper as all are now under engagement. No first class skipper has yet been approached by Sir Thomas. Sycamore is on the Navahoe, Bevis on the White Heather, Winge on the Susanne, and Hogarth on the Maynon. No foundation for statement, Lipton will fit out Shamrock III."

By the above it will be seen that all the best men are now under engagement for the coming season with British owners.
