### John Smith And His Car

John Smith is a character whom every motorist should welcome. He is not selfish, rather he is a motoring martyr, a chap willing and glad to have exploited, in an interesting way, his experiences for the benefit of the other twenty

or replaced with new ones." "How about spring covers?" Smith asked.

"That's another big story," I replied. "Almost any cover will keep out water and grit, and it is obvious that springs need such protection. However, merely covering the springs is no assurance against further trouble. There are many covered springs in service that are in worse condition than many uncovered ones.

"Grease covers are being condemned at the present time by many who favor oil covers, but there still is something to be said for the variety that uses grease.

If you have such covers taken off each year and the leaves spread apart and regreased the situation probably will be devoid of objection. The trouble is most car owners see all that grease being packed around their springs and figure that it is good for the life of the car. That's nonsense, because grease soon starts to cake and on-ly on the hottest days is it of any advantage.

"I've seen grease come out between leaves in such form that it resembled tinfoil. When replacement springs are used it is customary for repairmen to squirt some penetrating oil over the leaves. Thus, if you are going to use grease as the spring leaves' lubricant and do not have an opportunity to take off the covers for periodic inspection, it is a good plan to pour some of this penetrating oil into the covers and let it do its missionary work.

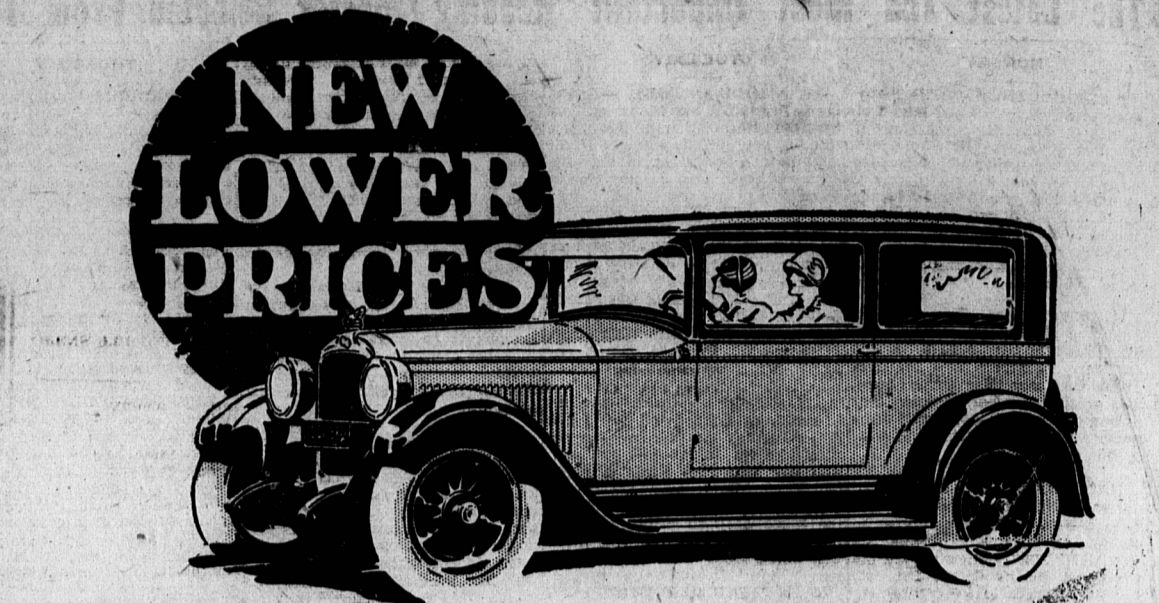
"Generally speaking, however, oil covers are considered best, but here again you must observe certain precautions. Because it is a simple matter to refill oil covers, most owners over-oil their springs, and too much lubricant will destroy the frictional qualities of the springs so necessary to good riding. A good rule to follow is to cover the springs of the car with an oil cover and refill it only when the springs start to squeak."

It was a big subject and I could only touch the high spots. But in parting I reminded Smith that if after operating his car as long as he decided to cover the springs and protect them he had better not overlook seeing to it that they were cleaned first. Thousands of car owners get this "saving the springs" habit only to put covers over dirty springs and miss most of the advantages which covers can give.

### RABBIT MEAT

The meat of a well fed rabbit is not only extremely tasty and palatable, but it has also a very high nutritive and digestive value, at the same time there is probably no meat the value of which has been so underestimated by the Canadian public. Unfortunately, in too many instances the rabbits exposed for sale are underfed, badly killed, and poorly packed, with the result that their appearance is far from appetizing.

In a bulletin of the Dominion Department of Agriculture on the general subject of rabbits, the author states that official analyses and expressed opinions of dietetic experts have demonstrated beyond doubt that the meat of properly fed rabbits has a higher nutritive and digestive value than that of practically any other animal.
