A number of the cars in "Mrs. Van" parade were dressed with flags.

Rev. J. Heaney, pastor of the First Methodist Church of this city, will have the sympathy of many friends on the death of his brother, Mr. Alfred E. Heaney, who passed away at his home in Clinton on Monday last. The late Mr. Heaney, who was only 36 years of age, was a son of Mr. Robert W. Heaney. He leaves to mourn his parents, a widow, Edith, daughter of Mr. William R. Dinan, three children, Edson, Florence and Alberta, aged 11, 7 and 4 respectively, two brothers, Rev. Jacob, of Charlottetown, and Wesley, of Clinton, six sisters, Mrs. George Glover, Mrs. W. H. Sharpe, Mrs. Frank Day, all of Norboro, Mrs. John T. Dignam, of Leary, Mrs. John W. Whithead, Clinton, Mrs. William R. McLeod, Portland, Oregon, besides a wide circle of relatives and friends. Mr. Heaney's death while in the full vigor of manhood comes as a crushing blow to the bereaved relatives and friends. He arrived home the first of May from Muskoka Cottage Sanitarium, where he had gone last September for treatment, and he seemed greatly improved. His friends were all encouraged to hope that he would be quite well. On Friday last he was taken ill but there did not seem to be much cause for alarm till Monday, when the end came quite suddenly at half-past seven in the morning. His unexpected death, in the midst of a strong hope for complete and early recovery, was a great shock to the community in which he was so well known and so greatly esteemed by all. The funeral took place on Tuesday at 2 p. m., and was very largely attended. The services were conducted by Rev. George Morris, who spoke in the church at Margate on: "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain." In the course of an impressive discourse, he paid a touching tribute to the life and character of the late Mr. Heaney, and to the burden of sorrow which the bereaved family are called upon to bear.
