Says a "Huge Mistake" Has Been Made

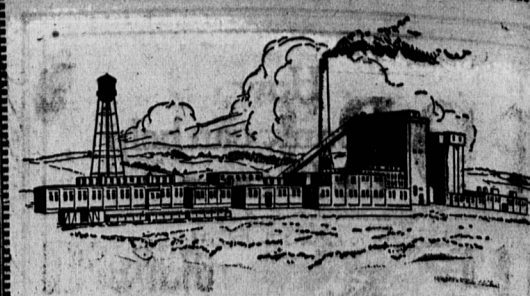
Union, but 23,000 more against Union. "In spite of that," Dr. Drummond adds, "the General Assembly decided to press on. Ever since there has been growing opposition and charges of 'breach of faith.' Now that the people have another opportunity of speaking, it is plain, from the vote being reported, that opposition has greatly increased. According to press reports of the votes cast, there is a clear majority of about 2,000 against. Nearly 500 so-called 'congregations' have gone in 'unanimously' and are not counted in the above. But these are composed almost entirely of little mission groups with an average of probably not more than 12 communicants. They deserve constant and most sympathetic care, but it is wholly misleading to add these hundreds as 'congregations,' and tell the public that 'the vote is now 5 to 1, or 4 to 1, or as may be. The vote to date shows about 50-50; anything but the 'entire membership,' or 'practically unanimous action.' It is generally admitted that a huge mistake has been made; that the leaders did not gauge popular feeling rightly at all. Had the first promoters been able to forecast and see what we see today, can anyone imagine their resolving to press right on? Is it not better to admit 'mistakes,' acknowledge that they are not the 'will of God,' and humbly seek a better way?"
