Investigating Strike Threats PARIS, May 4.—Additional arrests were exacted today in government's effort to break general strike called by railway, dock and mine workers to enforce their demands for nationalization of basic industries. A cabinet was in session again today to take further action on government's program, strike, which it was learned officially is considered revolutionary in character, although strikes in all their manifestations have emphasized statements they would return to work as soon as their economic aims were achieved.
