### Czech Tennis Stars Turn Back On Native Land

**GSTAD, Switzerland, July 18**—(AP)—Jaroslav Drobny and Vladimir Cernik, two of the world's best known tennis players, turned their backs on their native Czechoslovakia today and prepared to seek admission to the United States as political refugees.

Here for the Swiss national championships, the two defied an order by the Communist-dominated Czech Government to return to Prague immediately because of the presence of two Germans and a Spaniard in the tournament. They said they would continue to play here, then enlist the aid of the United States Lawn Tennis Association and friends abroad in gaining a haven as exiles in the United States.

(In Washington, State Department officials said any request by Drobny and Cernik to enter the United States would be received "sympathetically". They pointed out that other foreign athletes had been permitted to come here after renouncing their governments.)

On the first day of his voluntary exile, Cernik reached the semi-finals of the Swiss tournament by defeating another political exile, Frano Puncce of Yugoslavia, 6-2, 6-2.

Puncce landed in the finals by default yesterday when Cernik and Drobny withdrew on orders of the Czech Government. But the two Czechs changed their minds this morning and announced they were not returning to Czechoslovakia.

At first, Puncce refused to give up his final berth. But he relented and was eliminated by Earl Cochell of San Francisco and Pedro Massip of Spain.

The two Czechs, who have represented their country in Davis Cup play every year since the war, also gained the fourth round in doubles here by beating J. P. A. Linck and A. L. Van Meergeren of the Netherlands 6-3, 6-2.

Swiss security police were sent from Bern today to see that neither of the new exiles was molested. "We wish to state that we are sportsmen completely devoted to tennis and in no way connected with politics," Drobny and Cernik said in a joint statement.

Cernik has a wife and three-year-old son in Prague. Drobny leaves his mother and 80-year-old father, manager of a Prague tennis club.
