FAMOUS WAR DOG "PETER" IS DEAD.

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 27.—Peter, famous war dog, although only a little Boston bull, is dead here at the home of his mistress, Mrs. R. H. Duce.
Peter was credited with having raised a \$9,000 war fund in Victoria, B.C., during the world war, by sitting on a table every day for three years and "speaking for contributions."
He received a medal from the Canadian Field Comforts Association in England, a life membership in the Canadian Red Cross and four other decorations, including one from the Yukon battalion.
After the war Peter went into the movies and gained more fame. He was nine years old when he died, after a brief illness.
