DENMARK'S AGED MONARCH DIED SUDDENLY YESTERDAY

Gave Audience in the Morning, Taken Ill at Luncheon and Died at 3.30 O'clock—His Son the Crown Prince Proclaimed Today as Frederick IX—The Ministry Resigns but is Continued—Half Europe's Courts are in Mourning.

COPENHAGEN, Jan. 29.—(Special).—Christian the Ninth, the aged King of Denmark, dean of the crowned heads of Europe and related by blood or marriage to most of the royal families, died with startling suddenness in Marienburg Palace this afternoon.
