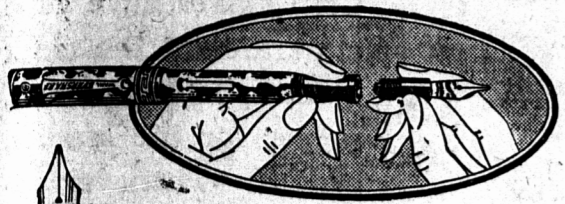

### PARA OIL AND GAS COMPANY FORMED

A new oil company, the Para Oil and Gas Company, is being formed with a capital of 500,000 shares of \$1.00 par value, of which 200,000 shares will be issued. Para Oil and Gas Company is well located in the Doyr Field and some of its acreage is adjoining Ajax no. 5 which is now being drilled and is expected to come in within the next ten days. The shares will be issued at 50 cents and the interest back of the company believe that in view of the low issued capital and the excellent location of their holdings these shares will sell much higher. Owing to the brisk advance in Ajax in the last few days and the similar location of the holdings of the Para Oil & Gas Co., the sponsors expect that this issue will be heavily over-subscribed.

### LARGE OIL FIELDS LOOM AS POSSIBILITY IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

For some time past it has been believed in oil circles that British Columbia would eventually assume a position of commanding importance as a producer of oil. This belief was fostered considerably by cursory examinations of the Peace River district, the Queen Charlotte Islands and other areas. Recently plans were laid before the British Columbia government by a syndicate claimed to be affiliated with the Anglo-Persian oil organization and which proposed to explore traces of oil throughout the province. The proposal included a suggestion to the government that a large area in the Peace River district be set aside to be systematically bored by the D'Arcy Development and Exploration Company. It is believed that this proposal is still in abeyance pending knowledge of the relation between the immediate promoters and Anglo-Persian Oil.

MONTREAL, Que., Aug. 26.—Cattle receipts 969, following a couple of weeks of fairly liberal supplies. Cattle buyers were not too keen and sales were low. The few sales made at time of writing were along the lines of \$7.00 to \$9.50 for steers and \$5.00 to \$8.50 for heifers. Good cows brought \$7.00 to \$7.50 with a couple choice cows at 8.00 and canners and cutters from \$3.00 to \$4.25. Bulls were a shade stronger at \$5.25 to \$5.75 for bolognas with odd sales at \$6.00. Quotations butcher steers good \$9.00 to \$9.50, medium \$8.50 to \$9.00, common \$6.50 to \$8.00. Butcher heifers good \$3.00 to \$8.50, medium \$7.25 to \$8.00, common \$5.00 to \$7.00. Butcher cows good \$7.00 to \$7.50, medium \$4.25 to 6.50, canners \$3.00 to \$3.50, cutters \$4.00 to \$4.25. Butcher bulls common \$5.25 to \$6.00. Calf receipts 1816. The trade on the calf was more active than last week and sales were made at 25 to 50 cents higher prices. Good calves were sold for \$11.00 to \$13.00, medium kinds were from \$8.50 to \$10.75, grazers brought \$6.00 to \$7.25 and common drinkers \$7.50 to \$8.50.
