Wide Upswing In Rails On New York Exchange Saturday

NEW YORK, Dec. 8—(AP)—A wide upswing in rails, following the long-awaited freight rate boost, featured Saturday's stock market although most other departments failed to participate to any great extent because of persistent pessimism over the national coal crisis.

With the bulge in the transportation section, the market made it two rising weeks in a row for the first time since last August.

Speed characterized the opening although the ticker tape kept up with the proceedings. There were subsequent slowdowns and top gains of one to four or more points were reduced by quick profit cashing at the close.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 7 of a point at 64.3 and on the week showed a net advance of 9 of a point. Of 835, registering, 488 rose and 190 declined during the day.

In front for the brief session were Norfolk & Western, up four at 20 1/2; Union Pacific 3 1/2 at 129 1/2; Great Northern 2 1/2 at 48 3/4; Santa Fe 2 1/2 at 93 1/2; Southern Railway 2 1/2 at 43 1/2; Pennsylvania Railroad 2 1/2 at 28 1/2; Milwaukee Preferred 2 1/2 at 47 1/2; and Northern Pacific 1 at 22 1/2.

Modest improvement was retained by Chrysler, General Motors, Goodrich, Sears Roebuck, International Harvester, International Telephone, Public Service of N. J., Westinghouse, Standard Oil (N.J.), Allied Chemical, General Electric, Johns-Manville and

SELECTING THE MATING PEN

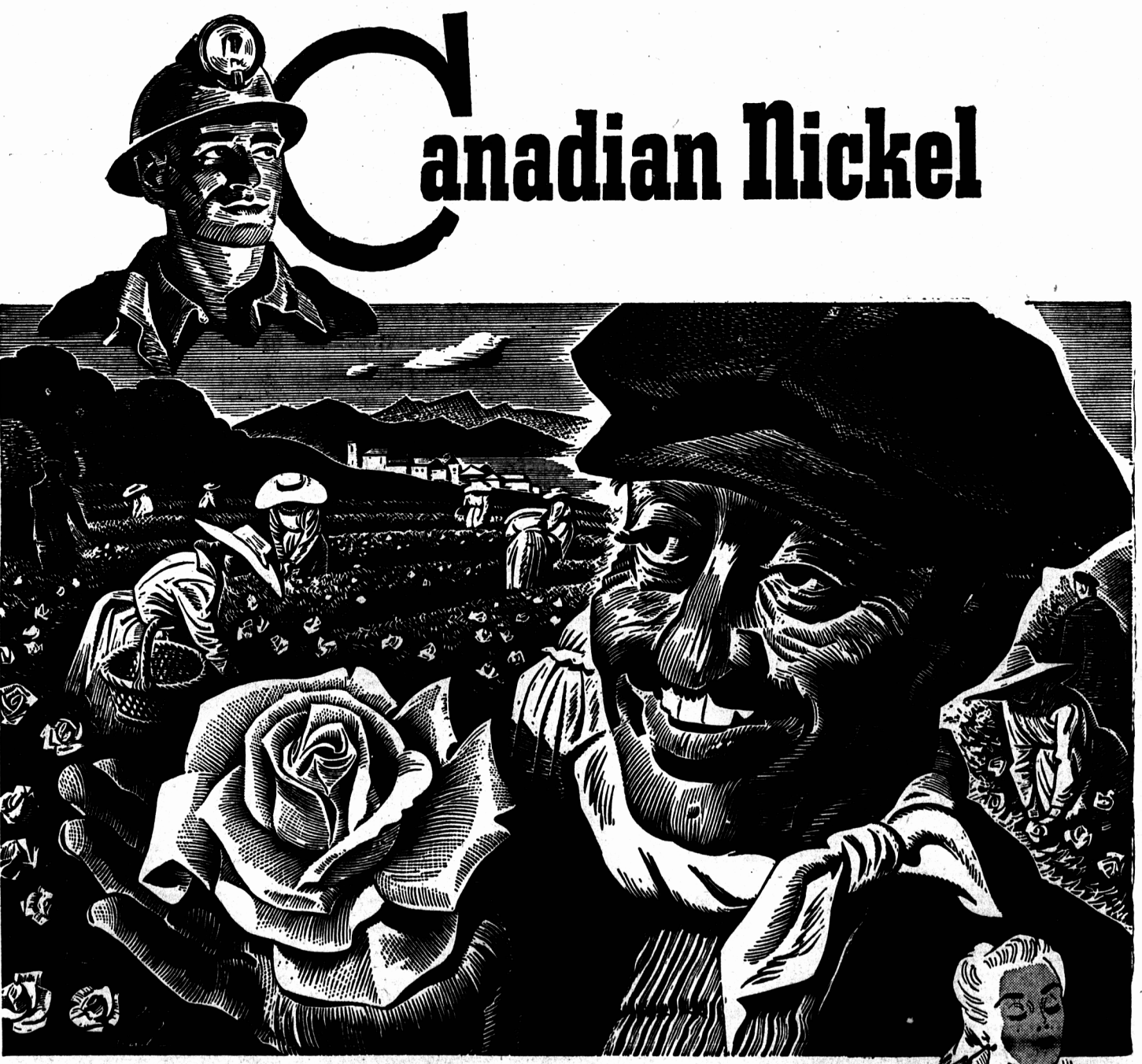
(Experimental Farms News)
Early in the year poultry raisers are concerned with making up the required number of mating pens for the hatching season. Whether or not an intensive, fully recorded system of pedigree breeding or a more liberal form of mating for the production of eggs for sale to commercial hatcheries is followed the general strength and vigour of the birds should be considered.

Over-fat, sluggish, lazy birds will prove disappointing from a breeder's standpoint, and those that are weak poorly developed are worse than useless, says B. F. Tinney, Dominion Experimental Station, Charlottetown, P.E.I.

Birds typical of the breed and only those that are strong and vigorous as indicated by close bright feathering, upright, alert carriage, prominent, bright eye and clean cut head and face free from heaviness or meanness should be selected. The birds, too, should be broad backed, deep deeked and straight, and full breasted. Disqualifications such as split wings, off-colour feathers, feather stubs and side sprigs are handicaps, so too are birds showing any eye defects such as distorted iris, grey or "pearly" eye, and those carrying too much fat.

While all these points apply to both males and females, it should be borne in mind that "the breeding male is half the flock" and selection of all males should receive special care.
