The latest news, first of all.

Miss Willena Riggs, City, who has been residing in Glace Bay, has accepted a position in Chatham, N.B.

A pretty calendar, with an artistic winter hunting scene as the front-piece, has been received from Ensley B. Johnson, manufacturer of printer's rollers, St John.

E. J. Hanson, Chief Steward of the steamer A. W. Perry has resigned and went to Boston by the steamer Halifax on Sunday where he will secure a situation in the States.—Halifax Echo.

B. Roy Holman, City, has returned from a business trip to New Brunswick. Mr Holman, in passing through Amherst, had the pleasure of meeting Earl Grey, who was in attendance at the Amherst Winter Fair.

Isaac Brown, Cherry Valley, appeared before J. A. Macdonald, Stipendiary Magistrate for Queen's County, for an infraction of the prohibition act. At the request of the counsel for the defendant the case was adjourned until Saturday morning.

Hector McNeill, Highfield, has returned to his home from Cambridge, Mass., where he was injured some time ago by falling from a building. It will be some time before Mr McNeill's injuries will be so far improved as to allow him to return to his duties.

At the last Provincial Exhibition held in this city the Canadian Bank of Commerce presented a medal to the cheesemaker exhibiting the six best factory cheese. This medal was won by Angus D. McLellan of St George's, and has been presented to its owner. The medal is a beautifully engraved one and is suitably inscribed.

At the Police Court in this city yesterday the prohibition case against Arthur Kenney, Richmond Street, was dismissed. In the case against Robert Stanley the witnesses had not been served and the case was adjourned until Saturday morning. J. Kelly, for first offence, was convicted and sentenced to a fine of \$100 and costs or three months. Daniel Cronin, Richmond Street, was also convicted, and his being second offence he had a fine of \$200 and costs or four months in jail. He took the latter.
