WOMAN FROZE TO DEATH NEAR HOME

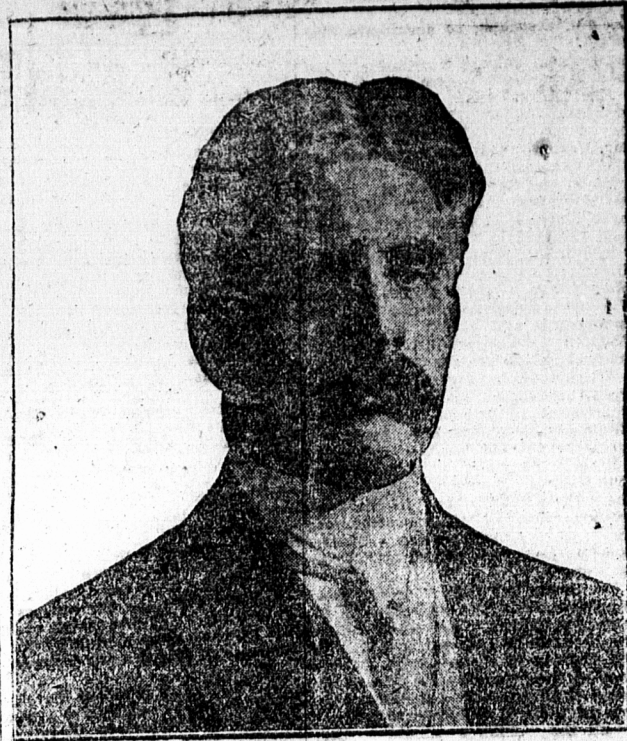
