Canada May Ship Coal To Japan
 OTTAWA, Dec. 26 — (CP) — Government officials said today Canada would be a likely supplier of coal for Japan when that country begins foreign purchases of the fuel, but that up to now there have been no Canadian-Japanese negotiations on coal.
 A Trade Department officer termed as "wishful thinking" a Tokyo report that the Japanese were negotiating with this country for coal to improve their steel output.
 Both the Trade Department and the economic division of the External Affairs Department said no direct negotiations between the countries had been initiated as yet.

Less Fish Landed In Canada This Year
 OTTAWA, Dec. 26 — (CP) — Canada's sea fisheries brought home 38,000,000 pounds less in the first 11 months of this year than in the same period of 1941, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported today. Landings of fish and shellfish were 1,038,000,000 pounds, compared with 1,136,000,000 in the first 11 months of last year.
 The Atlantic coast accounted for the whole drop. Landings on that coast in the period this year were 536,200,000 pounds, down almost 14 per cent from the same month of 1941.
 Pacific coast landings of 56,500,000 pounds in November were down 23 per cent.
 The Atlantic catch in November was 34,400,000 pounds, an increase of seven per cent over the same month last year. The quantity of sardines brought in more than doubled the amount for a year previously. The smelt fishing season got under way, but early catches were reported as only fair.

First African Co-Op
 LUSAKA, Northern Rhodesia — (CP) — The first African co-operative society has been formed in Northern Rhodesia. Tobacco and groundnut farmers who have been operating successfully as a producers' association have agreed to register as a co-operative. Hitherto they marketed their produce through the government.

The liquor traffic has scored many a victory, both legally and personally, and we see the casualties all around us. What is more, they have mined the ground on which our youth tread innocently. They have laid subtle booby traps. The folks who actually lay these traps are often not the liquor people themselves but prominent, otherwise cultured citizens of the community, whose personal attitudes and practices actually do much to influence the inexperienced and the ambitious. Many a person with firm convictions and a good background of temperance teaching weakens and yields when he or she sees some other "nice" person nonchalantly sipping cocktails. It doesn't take much of this sort of thing to undermine the courage and fortitude of the one who feels that he must win social approval in order to be successful. Selected Utilities And Oils Active At Montreal
 MONTREAL, Dec. 26 — (CP) — Selected utilities and oils were the centre of trading today on the stock exchange and curb market. Other groups were steady to slightly easier. Price changes were fractional, with the exception of some of the utilities where a few gains exceeded a point. Mines were fractionally higher in light trading.
 Closing averages indicated banks off 0.05 at 27.75; utilities off 0.3 at 73.7; industrials off 0.4 at 124.5; papers off 1.16 at 370.74; golds up 0.15 at 75.43. Approximate industrial sales were 20,200 shares while mining volume amounted to 70,600 shares at 14 1/2.
 In utilities Winnipeg Electric, on a turnover of 2,370 shares touched a new high of 23, but in late trading dropped 1-2 to close 22 1/2-1/2. Brazilian added 1-2 at 15 5/8-1/2. Power Corporation went ahead 3-4 points at 14 3/4 on a turnover of 1,080 shares.
 On a turnover of 2,250 shares, Home Oil reached a new high of 62 1/2 gaining 25 cents. Consolidated Homestead advanced 1-4 at 16 1/4, on a turnover of 4,500 shares. Imperial Oil was 1-4 better at 13 1/4 and International Petroleum added 3/4 at 14 1/2.
 In papers, B. C. Forest went forward 1-8 at 4, but Consolidated Paper was shaded at 19 1/8-3/8. C.P.R. was off 1-8 at 11 3/8-1/8 in carriers.
 Eldona, on a turnover of 3,300 shares, advanced 1/2 at 21 1/2-1/2. MacDonald was up 5 cents at 1.50 and Beaulieu gained 2 1/4 cents at 22 1/4-1/4. Quebec Manganese dropped two cents at 69 on a turnover of 810 shares.
 Trading box score: Stocks traded 128; higher 38; lower 37; unchanged 50; new highs 4; new lows 2.

New York Stocks Suffered Severe Dip Yesterday
 (By Victor Eubank)
 NEW YORK, Dec. 26 — (AP) — The stock market today suffered its sharpest average dip since early in the month although dealings were relatively slow as the heaviest snowstorm since the turn of the century hit the city and caused numerous customers to desert Wall Street and extend the Christmas holidays.
 The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off 7 of a point at 64.9.
 Canadian issues were irregular. Dome Mines gained 1-8 while Canadian Pacific lost 3-8. Distillers Seagram and Hiram Walker were unchanged.
 On the Curb Lake Shore eased 1-8 while Giant Yellow Knife was unquoted.
 Only 130,000 shares changed hands in the first hour, a low for this period of a full season since Sept. 26. Volume for the five hours of 830,000 shares compared with 1,180,000 Wednesday and was a minimum for a like period since Dec. 3.
 Exceptions on the day's stumble were Douglas Aircraft up 1 1/2 at 49, Homestake Mining up 1 1/4 at 38 7/8 and J. I. Case up 1 1/8 at 41.
 Declines of 1 to 2 points or more were shown for Santa Fe at 91 1/4, Southern Railway 39, Union Pacific 159, Pacific Western Oil 47, Ontario Oil 37 1/8, U. S. Steel 78 1/4, Bethlehem Steel 109, Chrysler 62 1/2 and U. S. Rubber 45 1/4.
