Anglican Church Considers Changing Name in Canada

By DAVE MCINTOSH HALIFAX, July 21—(CP)—The Church of England in Canada is thinking of changing its name. The subject will come up at the Church's General Synod here Sept. 17. Church spokesmen explained today that the Church of England in Canada had been an autonomous, national church since 1893. Its present name, they said, lets many think it still is tied to the Church of England in the United Kingdom.

Several new names already have been suggested, among them the Episcopal Church of Canada, the Canadian Church of Canada, and the Anglican Church of Canada. Others probably will be suggested at the Synod. A new name is only one of the many subjects on a heavy agenda to be presented to the Synod, which meets every three years. Others include the admission of Newfoundland as the 28th diocese, clarification of the application of Church laws on marriage and divorce, missionary policy in the Canadian Northwest, report on reunification of the church with the United Church of Canada and application of the gospel to current social conditions.

Churchmen said the application of the gospel to social conditions will be an important subject of debate. They said the Church is concerned about the housing situation because the home, the foundation of family religion, "cannot function under current housing conditions." "more vigorous" missionary policy in the Canadian Northwest will be sought and extension of missionary work in India also will be discussed. Other subjects to come up are a fixed primacy should be kept in one ecclesiastical province and definition of the jurisdiction of the provinces and dioceses.

Coal Production

OTTAWA, July 20—(CP)—Coal Production in Canada during June continued the downward trend of previous months and slipped six per cent below last year to 1,322,000 tons, compared with 1,404,000 in June, 1948, the Bureau of Statistics reported today. However, figures for the first half of the year showed a gain over 1948 with production advancing to 9,167,000 tons as against 8,882,000. Production went ahead in Saskatchewan, British Columbia and the Yukon during the month, compared with last year, but fell back in the other Provinces. Imports during June were down per cent to 3,010,000 tons, compared with 3,885,000 in June last year, bringing the total imports for the first six months to 10,735,000 against 11,379,000 in the like period of 1948.
