GRAIN COMPETITION—The standing field of Grain Competition this year has been put on a new basis; the counties being divided into three sections each, instead of two, as was previously the case. The divisions are made as follows:—West Prince, 1st Electoral District, and Lots 7 and 8; East Prince, 4th, and 5th, Electoral District, and Lot 15. Central Prince, shall include the remainder of Prince County, West Queen's, 1st Electoral District, in Township 23, East Queen's the remainder of Queen's County, lying north of Hillsboro River. South Queen's shall include that part of Queen's County lying southeast of Hillsboro River. East King's includes Townships, No. 12, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 55, and 56; South King's, Townships No. 59, 61, 63, 64, and Georgetown, Kings County. The prize list has also been revised and will be published in a later issue. An announcement is in the printer's hands and will be distributed as soon as possible. In the meantime competitors may enter fields, on a field of each, wheat, oats and barley, as usual, by sending their names to the Provincial Department of Agriculture. As a result of this re-distribution and rearrangement, it is expected that a much larger number will be made, and this arrangement will reach those farmers that have never entered this competition.

GLENFINNAN—Mr. Leo MacDonald of the Department of Agriculture is engaged in spraying the orchards in this vicinity.—Mr. William Robertson, who has been in the United States for some time past, has returned home.—Lot 48 Cheese factory opened on Monday the 15th inst., in charge of Mr. McCormac of St. George's.—Mr. Albert Robertson has taken the contract for milk hauling on the Glenfinnan-Johnson River route.—The capable Road Master, Mr. D. J. McDonald, had the road work done early this spring and as a consequence the roads in this locality are in splendid condition.—The Johnston's River Silver Black Fox Company, recently organized, have about completed selling their stock.—The Committee of Fort Augustus Parish intend having the Church painted this summer.—Mr. Malcolm McDonald sold a fine horse for a handsome sum.—The grass owing to the recent rains is looking fine and there is every prospect of an abundant hay crop.—Mr. Joseph McEachern has gone to work on the Cal Ferry terminal at Carleton Point. He reports work plentiful and wages good.—Arbor Day was generally observed by the Schools in this vicinity much tree-planting was done. The teachers also took advantage of the day to prepare school gardens, the majority of them being quite enthusiastic over the new department. Seedling is well advanced, and will in all probability be completed this week.

FATAL ACCIDENT IN NOVA SCOTIA.

PARRSBORO, June 22.—A shooting accident which resulted fatally occurred in the woods between Sand River and Port Greville on Saturday afternoon. Four men named Charles Dow, David Cole, Clifford Spicer, and Wells Cole, started to go home to spend Sunday. Dow undertook to show the others a short cut through the woods but found the path grown up with bushes. In attempting to crawl through the thicket a Winchester rifle he was carrying was discharged, the ball shattered his arm badly and then passed through Wells Cole's thigh inflicting a dangerous wound. One of the men came to Parrsboro for a doctor as quickly as possible but before aid reached the wounded man Dow had died from the effects of the wounds. Wells Cole is seriously injured but it is hoped he will recover. The accident has naturally created a great sensation at Port Greville and vicinity.
