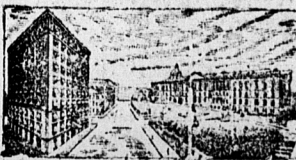

The prices quoted by the wholesalers are:—Potatoes, 60c; pressed hay, \$13; white oats, 50c to 52c; black oats, 52 to 56c; pork, 7c to 9c; straw, \$5.50 and turnips 17c.

The death of Colin McNevin occurred at his residence, Pearl Street, about 10 o'clock this morning. Deceased was a native of Prince Edward Island, and was in his 87th year, he had been in failing health for the past three months; death was due to the infirmities of old age.

The members of the Canadian Club were last evening addressed by Capt. W. A. McKee, and Rev. W. G. Law on South Africa and the Boer War. Both gentlemen held the attention of the audience throughout their respective addresses, which were very interesting. Capt. McKee was the first speaker. He referred to the great work done by the first Canadian contingent, also the second (Canadian Rifles, and Field Hospital Corps, of which he was a member, also military life in its various phases, and gave a general description of the hardships endured and the dangers met with in South Africa, which is a tropical country. He told how one valiant Canadian, Lieut. Bruce Carruthers, with seventeen men, withstood the attack of a large party of Boers, until finally through hunger, thirst, and fatigue they were compelled to surrender. After making prisoners of them, the Boers stripped them and left them to wander in the hot desert. He mentioned the conditions under which the Kafirs and Boers live, also the fierce sand storms that occur with great frequency in that climate. He also mentioned the hardships that the men had to endure in camp from insects, such as centipedes, scorpions, tarantulas, etc. The bites and stings of some of these insects are very poisonous. He next dwelt on the amusements in militia camp life, and related some amusing references.—Moncton Exe. (Capt. McKee is a native of Charlottetown.)
