IN MEMORIAM

Father Stephen T. Phelan, another aged and faithful member of the Catholic Clergy, passed to his eternal rest last evening at 6 o'clock, in the Charlottetown Hospital, in the person of Father Stephen T. Phelan.

He was educated at St. Dunstan's College and the Grand Seminary, Quebec, being ordained priest in 1876. He was for several years attached to the Cathedral staff, afterwards being appointed parish priest of Alberton, and Lot 7.

In 1889 he was appointed to the pastorate of Georgetown and Cardigan and later Georgetown and Montague.

Some time ago his health began to fail and two weeks ago he was removed to the Charlottetown Hospital where he gradually sank, till the end came.

He was a nephew of the late Father Thomas Phelan and was of a charitable and friendly disposition, being very popular, especially with the young, whom he delighted to help and encourage.

The body will be removed to the Railway Station this afternoon whence it will be conveyed by the 3 o'clock train east to Georgetown, where interment will take place.

The funeral takes place Thursday morning at 10 o'clock and a special train will leave Charlottetown for the funeral Thursday morning at 8 o'clock.

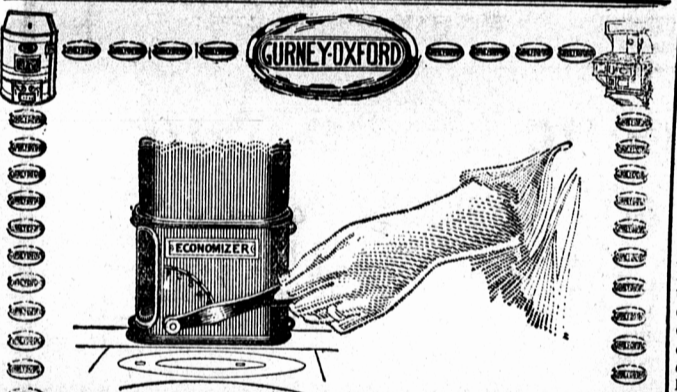
