PROHIBITION AMENDMENTS.

We printed yesterday the amendments to the Prohibitory Law proposed by the Grand Division of Sons of Temperance. The amendments are designed to make the law more workable and effective, to check evasions of the spirit of the Act such as have been met with and to perfect the machinery for enforcement. It is for instance notorious that beer is sold of a decidedly intoxicating quality, yet which the consumers will swear produces no intoxicating effect. The amendment proposed prohibits the sale of any products of the brewery capable of being drunk for their intoxicating effect, without any regard to the percentage of alcohol they may contain or be supposed to contain. Another proposed amendment makes it an offence to keep liquors for sale. The search warrant clause is amended by supplying a defect found in the working of that service, and an addition is proposed to be made to the Act requiring that persons arrested for intoxication shall be obliged to give testimony as to where and of whom they purchased the liquor that intoxicated them. As we have said the proposed amendments are designed to render the present excellent law more effective in its working. They are in accord with the spirit of the Act the prime object of which is to abolish the sale of intoxicating liquors for beverage purposes. To that object the Legislature and the Province are irreversibly committed. The Legislature has already responded promptly when amendments to the Act were called for and will we believe consider these further proposed amendments in a friendly and judicious spirit. Only those who are opposed to the principle of prohibition are likely to oppose such amendments as must tend to make the law in the highest degree effective.

The Grand Trunk Pacific scheme if supplemented by a tunnel under the Straits of Northumberland would look much better in the eyes of Prince Edward Islanders. Think of the three Legislatures of Quebec, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, all in the same month failing to meet at the time appointed. The coincidence is a strange one. Think of how the tunnel would promote tourist travel! Sea-sickness avoided, time saved, no fear of summer or winter storms. And thousands who otherwise might not visit us would come to see and pass through the tunnel. It has become a proverb that "snow is the farmer's manure." In most cases, a winter of deep snow, which falls early and keeps the ground deeply covered as during the present season, is followed by good hay crops. In the present great shortage of hay our farmers may take comfort from the prospect of abundant grass and hay next summer, should the growing season prove reasonably favorable.

The intense cold, heavy ice and long detention of the winter steamers all appeal powerfully for a railway tunnel. No other solution of our difficulties can approach the tunnel in completeness. No other plea will fulfil the terms of union, satisfy the Island and free the Dominion from the serious liability it incurs from making a yearly default in regard to continuous communication.

At the recent annual meeting of the New Brunswick Tourist Association the fact was brought out that big game is increasing throughout the forest covered portion in the centre of the Province. Moose are now reported very plentiful, as also deer, bears and other game. One guide who had attended tourist visitors last season reported that he had personally seen hundreds of moose.

We hear little more as to the Government's promised measure to give provincial autonomy to the Northwest. The questions commonly asked are whether there will be one, two or three provinces, what financial terms they are to be given, and lastly on what basis the school question will be settled. Each of these points will furnish ground for sharp differences of opinion. As the autonomy bill is the only important measure promised in the speech from the throne it is high time that its more important features should be known to the House and the country.

It was most unfortunate that the fierce storm of Tuesday last made it almost impossible to hold the meetings called for that evening by Capt. Read to elect delegates to the convention on winter service to be held in Charlottetown one week later. Some meetings may have been held that we have not heard of. So far only two meetings—Montague and Kensington—have been reported in the press. It seems important that meetings should yet be held and delegates elected in those sections where the storm prevented them on the date first named.
