Ralston Asks Information Of Successor

OTTAWA, Nov. 23 — (CP) — Col. J. L. Ralston listened to his successor, Gen. McNaughton, advocate partial conscription in the Commons today and then in his first Parliamentary utterance since his resignation he said there appeared little difference between him and the Defence Minister on policy. "Why the resignation?" asked Gen. McNaughton when he completed the reading of his 5,000 word prepared statement, Gordon Gray, Progressive Conservative House Leader, said he thought Col. Ralston should have "right of way" in questioning the General. Col. Ralston said it might be more useful to the House if information which bordered on secrecy could be listened to with the galleries cleared. "I am not here as the public interrogator but as the humble member for Prince (in Prince Edward Island)." When he said there appeared little difference between him and Gen. McNaughton in policy, government supporters applauded vigorously. There was some discussion between the General and Col. Ralston on the technical basis on which reserve pools are established. Col. Ralston then asked if figures could be made public of past experience—the number who should have been in the northwest European pool two months ago and the number actually there. Gen. McNaughton said he "was not skilled in the art of debate" and while he had the figures he preferred not to use them. Col. Ralston said he thought there was some "skillful wording" in the general's address. Then with a smile at his successor he added "I've done the same thing myself."

Ralston's Plan

Col. Ralston referred to a plan for the dispatching of reinforcements from November to May. Gen. McNaughton said he was familiar with the plan which he saw when he took over the ministry and the 4,500 provided by it were to be additional to the 16,000 men he said in the Commons today were required. Col. Ralston's plan provided for 1,500 men being made available by accelerating dispatch of reinforcements overseas. 1,500 men other than infantry to be sent directly overseas and remustered there, 750 non-commissioned officers to be demoted to private and paid at N C O rates for a certain period and 750 infantry tradesmen to be used for general duty but given trade pay. In addition it had been proposed that 500 could be obtained by taking reduced physical standards but neither Col. Ralston nor Gen. McNaughton approved this suggestion.

Canada Much In U. S. News

CHICAGO, Nov. 23 — (CP) — Canada has been in the spotlight in degree this month and not only because of the prominence given here to news of the events leading up to this week's special session of parliament. The Canadian delegation to the international civil aviation conference which opened Nov. 1 has been engaged in strenuous effort to bring together from widely separated points of determination the United Kingdom and United States delegations. In that role the Canadians apparently have won the respect and admiration of all delegations of 44 countries represented here and if the conference is a complete success much of the credit will go to the delegation from Canada. The struggle has been between the extreme international control of commercial air operations between countries advocated by the British delegates, and the freedom to engage in open competition through bilateral agreements, proposed by the United States. H. J. Symington, hard-headed head and business executive and Lines, accustomed to the quick, incisive methods of his business, worked himself weary at attempting to bring together the suave, diplomatic, Adolin Berle, United States delegation head and the experienced, politico-diplomat, Viscount Swinton, British group leader. The applause which greeted Mr. Symington's brief rejection of the Berle-Swinton proposal to end the outstanding issues, coming from delegates and spectators alike in a close-packed open plenary session and speeches which followed.
