#### PLEASANT EVENT.

#### MINTO ARRIVES.

The Minto arrived in Georgetown yesterday at 10 a.m. from Picton with express, 151 tons of freight, 30 passengers and 42 sacks of paper and letter mail. She will leave for Picton this morning.

#### EARL GREY LEAVES.

The Earl Grey left Georgetown yesterday morning for Picton, with express, 27 tons of freight, 25 passengers and 30 sacks of paper and letter mail and docked in Picton at 9.30 a.m. She will leave Picton this morning on return.

#### SERIOUS FIRE.

Last Sunday about noon the house of Edward Duff, Mt. Stewart, caught fire from a chimney which passed through an upstairs closet and which had a pipe hole in it where it passed through the closet. The hole was pasted over with a paper but when the chimney caught from the stove below this paper burned off and consequently the clothing hanging in the apartment was soon blazing. Mr. and Mrs. Duff lost nearly all their outfits. Some damage was done to the house but the fire was quickly overcome by the ready work of willing hands. Mr. Duff's loss will not be more than \$150.00.

#### PROMINENT MAN.

The Guardian has received a copy of the Moose Jaw Evening Times containing a lengthy article on Moose Jaw's Halls of Justice. Among the prominent photos given is one of J. A. Munroe, Clerk of the Court, with the following details:—"J. A. Munroe, the popular clerk of the court, is a native of Prince Edward Island, and it was in that province that he received his early education. In 1884 he left the old home in the maritime province and came to the West, settling first of all in Prince Albert where he sought to follow up his profession as a public school teacher. Leaving Prince Albert in 1903 he came to Moose Jaw and still followed up his profession. This he pursued till 1905. In that year he entered the law office of Knowles and Hare. With this firm he finished out his course, and was admitted to the Bar of Saskatchewan in 1910, and in the month of May of the same year he received his appointment to the office of Clerk of the Court. Since that time he has, through his courtesy, won many friends, and is held in high esteem throughout the entire country. The work during Mr. Munroe's regime has greatly increased, and to such an extent that he has made application to the Department at Regina to add an additional clerk to the present staff. His request has been granted and an appointment has already been made." In speaking of the area covered by the court the paper says it is "almost sixteen times as large as the Province of Prince Edward Island. This is, therefore, doubtless, "some territory."

## FOOLISH TO VOTE FOR RECIPROCITY.

NEW YORK, Feb. 5—"You would have been very foolish to vote for the reciprocity agreement, for now the Democrats will give everything free entry into the States you would have had, and without a single concession on your part."

These words were spoken to The Toronto News correspondent by a politician high in the councils of his party, who knows what is going on at Washington—as well as at Albany.

If true, they are of tremendous importance. They mean the Conservative policy of 1911 has won out. By "standing pat" Canada gets "larger markets" for much of her produce, without handing over one tithe of her inheritance upon the northern part of the North American continent. All the advantages of reciprocity without any of the disadvantages. Something for nothing because public sentiment over the cost of living in the United States has forced the Democratic party to lower the excessive tariff wall against Canada.

And Canada in her turn is not compelled to open her markets to American competition.
