3 eggs
1/2 cup water

PEANUT BUTTER COOKIES

1/2 cup shortening
1 cup peanut butter
1/2 cup brown sugar
2 eggs
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 tablespoon vinegar
2 cups flour
1 teaspoon soda
1/2 teaspoon salt

Method: Cream the shortening until light and then cream in the peanut butter. Gradually cream in the brown sugar. Beat the eggs lightly and add to the creamed mixture, and continue beating about 5 dozen cookies.

Price Control Questions and Answers

Questions and Answers on Price Control will appear in The Guardian as a regular feature each day. The questions are those which have reached the Wartime Prices and Trade Board from housewives in this region. The answers are provided by the Board Readers. For sons who have intelligent questions to ask on price control are invited to send them in writing to the Women's Regional Advisory Committee of the War Time Price and Trade Board.

Q. Would you please tell me if seeds, plants, trees, and shrubs come under the price ceiling regulations? I receive catalogue each year and find the prices very much higher this year.

A. The price of plants, trees, shrubs and other nursery stock are exempt from Board regulations. It is very difficult, if not impossible, to fix maximum prices on products which depend on so many variable conditions such as weather, yield of products resulting from the labour involved etc. The price of seeds is controlled by a Board order.

This recipe will make about 5 dozen cookies.
