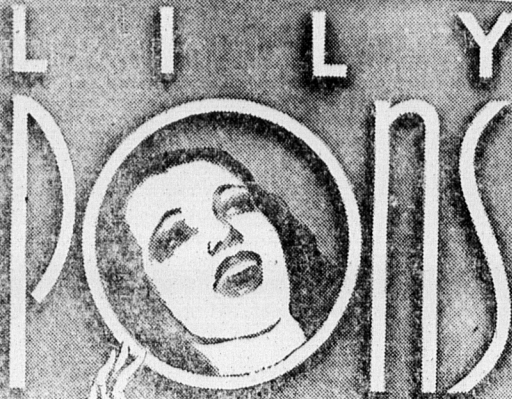

BERLIN, Nov. 6 (CP-Havas) - The German Government announced today it would borrow an additional 500,000,000 marks from its banks, its industries and its people.
