OF LOCAL INTEREST.—Rev. R. H. Staver, of Norton, most worthy patriarch of the Sons of Temperance of North America, has gone Tuesday for a short holiday trip to Grand Manitowlin Island. While in Ontario Mr Staver will deliver a number of lectures in the interests of the Sons of Temperance and will attend the annual session of the grand division of Ontario before returning.

LINEN SHOWER.—Mrs. L. C. Worthing gave a very successful linen shower last week in honour of Mrs Albert Dumont, formerly Miss Blanch Tombs. DRAINAGE EXPERIMENT.—The first report from the underdrainage demonstration field at Wellington was received on Saturday by Prof. Reek from Rev. P. P. Arsenault. Father Arsenault reports that every drain worked to its full capacity during last week's heavy rain. The surface of the field showed no indication of standing water although the adjacent fields had their usual amount of surface water. This is the first opportunity of testing the efficiency of the drains since they were installed and it is very satisfactory.

SERIOUS ACCIDENT.—On Friday morning last, while superintending the loading of a cargo of hay, Mr. E. Boswell, merchant, Victoria, met with a serious accident which luckily did not prove fatal. He was standing on the edge of the wharf as the hay was being taken on to the Schooner Alhambra by means of a derrick when a bale struck him precipitating him over the wharf. The tide being low the schooner was below the level of the wharf and the downward fall of his head struck against her rail, cutting and bruising it badly. He fell between the schooner and the wharf from which he was rescued by willing hands. Dr. Boyver was immediately summoned and fixed up the wound. He is now able to be about again although he received a bad shaking up.—V.
