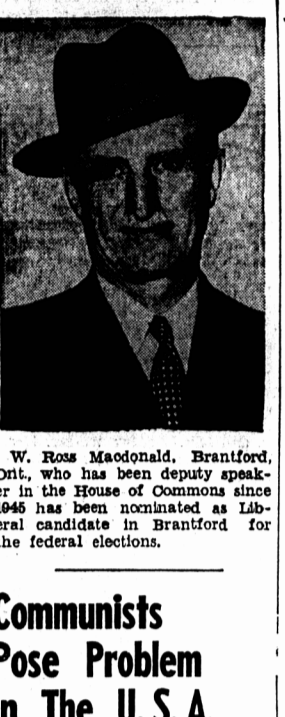

Do you bar a boy from education in a field for which he is obviously fitted and in which he may one day prove invaluable because he is a Communist and, as such, might one day betray a national trust?

Hans Freistadt's atomic energy fellowship at the University of North Carolina has created a stink. Hans is a member of the Communist Party. Permitted to pursue his chosen line of work, he might some day be in a position to betray atomic secrets. He says he never would. He says he is a loyal American, just following ideas he thinks will improve his country.

Hans, by his own statements, really is just an idealistic boy fumbling his way around in a maze of problems for which no one has found any complete solution. By his statements, he isn't really a good party member and doesn't even know what the Communist movement really stands for. He doesn't even know that it is controlled from Moscow, that it believes it must establish itself in the United States through violence. He's thinking about Marxist theory, not the 1949 offspring of the wedding of Communism with Russia's ancient imperialism.

Paul Hoffman, director of the Economic Co-operation Administration, recently explained very succinctly why this confusion exists:

"We must not be deceived by the Communist trappings with which this (Russian) power drive (a force he described as ruthless as Genghis Khan) is clothed. Basically, Communism is a rather idealistic concept, carrying with it connotations of sharing and universal brotherhood. In its pure form, almost the worst thing that can be said about Communism is that it won't work."

"But the ideology which the Russian Cominform is trying to spread is something very different indeed. It is the philosophy of power in its most wicked form; a way of life that enslaves bodies, withers minds and distorts all values."

Hans Freistadt has the company of many more experienced and supposedly wiser people who have been confused throughout all time by evil hiding under the guise of do goodism. But he and others like him are a problem. In their idealism they say "my country"—if right. But not if wrong? They thus set themselves up as judges for a country of 140,000,000 people.

The fault in Hans Freistadt's case lies in his teachers, who have not made clear to him the difference between idealism and the other forces of world politics. So many teachers of today are so afraid of being labelled Conservatives that they do not post the needed warning signs along their Liberal routes. Proper teaching would prevent the production of many Hans Freistads.

Two Vermonters In Jail For Debt

RUTLAND, Vt., May 19—(CP)—In Vermont a man can be jailed for failing to meet a court judgment and never know when he's going to get out.

Two men are in that spot now and they are not likely to be free unless they can raise more than \$2,000 each or take an oath under which they declare themselves paupers.

The pair are Ralph J. Fugatt of Springfield, Mass., and Bernard Smith Jr. of Fair Haven, Vt. In separate cases growing out of automobile accidents a judgment of \$2,189 was ordered by a court against Fugatt and another of \$2,375 against Smith.

Fugatt has been in jail seven weeks and Smith nearly as long. They're held there by a Vermont law dating from the early 1800s—a "close jail execution," which does not permit bail.

Court sources here said in the past persons imprisoned under that law have been held for at least six months before being given a hearing in which they have the choice of paying or declaring themselves paupers.
