

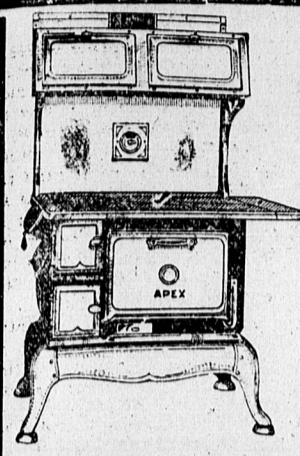

Grand Circuit

The returns for 1936 show that a number of world's records were reduced on both the mile and half-mile tracks. Six names were added to the two minute list, three of them being trotters and three pacers.

At Syracuse during the New York State Fair the five year old horse Scotland reduced his record to 1:59. This performance gave his dam three representatives in that select circle, her others being Rose Scott 1:59 and the pacer Highland Scott which was driven to a record of 1:59 at Goshen in 1929 by Mrs. E. Roland Harriman.

Both of the other trotters made their records at Lexington. In the first heat of the Kentucky Futurity, Hanover's Bertha won in two minutes. This mark stood until October 6, when in a trip against time this marvellous filly broke the tie between Mr. McElwain and Spencer by reducing the world's record for three year old trotter to 1:59. This time for each quarter in this mile was 31, 29, 29, 29. The last three quarters were trotted at the rate of 1:58 for a mile. When a horse can trot four quarters that average 29 seconds there will be a new world's record of 1:56.

The day that Hanover's Bertha made the new three year old record was also made memorable by her four year old sister Miss Bertha Hanover reducing her race record of 2:03 to two minutes. The fractional time for her mile was 30, 29, 29, 29.

These two mares are sisters of Charlotte Hanover, which won in 2:04 at Syracuse and was only beaten a proverbial eyelash by Protector in 2:03 at Lexington. These three fillies are by Peter Volo out of Miss Bertha Dillon by Dillon Axworthy. They are also the most remarkable group of young trotters that were ever produced by a mare.

May E. Grattan was the first pacer to step into the two minute list in 1930. No effort was made to give her a fast record. She was out for the money and won it.

After landing the \$10,000 events at Avon and Windsor, May E. Grattan was shipped to Cleveland where she won in 2:01. The next stop was at Kalamazoo where after losing the first heat of the \$25,000 pace to Calumet Adam in 2:01 and the second

to Enoch Guy in 2:02, she won in 2:01 and 2:02.

At Toledo the following week May E. Grattan won again in 2:01. Then after skirmishing around the Ohio half-mile tracks for three weeks, she took the word at Springfield during the Illinois State Fair and won in 1:59. May E. Grattan swung into the Grand Circuit the next week at Goshen. She won again and cut her record to 1:59 in a third heat. The last quarter of this mile was paced in 28. After being defeated by Harry D. in the \$10,000 Handicap at Syr half-mile track where she started off in the king row at Reading by reducing the two lap course record for pacing mares held by Grace Direct to 2:01.

Kinney Direct paced in 1:59 in the second heat of a race at Lexington. Harry D. forced him out after winning a heat from him in 2:00.

During the Lexington meeting Willow Grattan also swung into the fast list by pacing a mile in two minutes. This remarkable mare has been hovering on the edge of this group for three seasons. In 1928 at Syracuse in the second heat of the \$10,000 pace she was timed separately in 1:59. This year at Goshen she won a special from Winnipig in 2:00.

While the two minute performers displayed the extreme speed in the Grand Circuit in 1936 there were a number of other horses that made remarkable flights in the races. In this group Guy Fletcher and Hollywood Chief topped the lot, each with a mile in 2:01.

Guy Fletcher made his record in the third heat of the only race in which he ever started over a mile track. On the other hand, Hollywood Chief was taken from the two lap courses because he could not make the turns. He won the Charter Oak Purse at Hartford as well as the Walnut Hall Cup and Transylvania at Lexington.

Guy Fletcher is by Guy Axworthy out of Hilda Fletcher by Peter the Great. In Hollywood Chief the combination of blood lines are reversed as he is by Peter Volo out of Hollywood Daisy by Guy Axworthy. Both of them are fine individuals.

- Star Etawah won at Toledo in 2:02, Cleveland in 2:03, and at Kalamazoo in 2:04. He also won the last time out at Lexington.

Hanover's Bertha was the star of this year's Grand Circuit. She won all of her engagements, including the Hambletonian Stake and Kentucky Futurity. She was also the leading money winner for the year, her total amounting to \$60,087.90. This does not include the amounts awarded the Hanover Shoe Farms for nominating her dam in the futurities.

Braden Heir won all of his races in the first loop of the Grand Circuit and scored his fifth victory at Indianapolis. Charlotte Hanover won at Cleveland and Syracuse where she trotted in 2:04 and added two events

to her score at Lexington. Calumet Bush won four of the two year old events before he lost form. He is a fast colt and is very apt to be an important factor in the futurities next year.

The Royal Lady started at almost all of the Grand Circuit meetings. She won at Toledo in 2:03, at Kalamazoo in 2:02, at Goshen in 2:03, and was timed separately better than two minutes at Lexington. Ovelmo Lad was also a busy pacer. He won in 2:05 at Toledo and in 2:02 and 2:03 at Lexington.

Hollywood Harrod until he met with a slight accident in the \$10,000 trot at Syracuse was rated as one of the leading stake horses. He scored at Cleveland in 2:06, at Kalamazoo in 2:04, and at Toledo in 2:02. At Hartford, Hollywood Chief defeated him in the Charter Oak Purse but he was back again on the firing line at Goshen where he won in 2:02. He also won from a standing start at Syracuse in 2:07.

Both Chestnut Burr and Cold Cash swung in from the half-mile tracks. The two year old won at Cleveland, Hartford and Goshen, while Cold Cash took the big end of the purse at Hartford, Goshen and Lexington where he won in 2:02.

Bob Galloway won in 2:03 at Cleveland and in 2:04 at Syracuse. Guy Britton gathered in the three year old pacing events at Hartford, Goshen where he paced in 2:04, and Syracuse. He also won a heat in 2:03 from Cold Cash at Lexington.

Falin won seven races at the Indianapolis meeting and three at Cleveland and Lexington. He is tied with Stokes who won eight events at Cleveland, four at Hartford, and three at Toledo where he landed Hollywood Harrod in 2:02 and Athlone Guy in 2:03.

All of Berry's winners were from the Hanover Shoe Farm, two of which have been referred to. His other leaders were Helen Hanover, Foster Dillon, and Miss Bertha Hanover. He won five races at Cleveland, four at Syracuse, and three at Kalamazoo. Also on account of an injury he had but two winners at Lexington where Childs and Egan substituted for him and won four races with horses from his stable.

Parshall won four races at the first Toledo meeting and four at Cleveland. He also landed three races at the second Toledo meeting and three at Indianapolis, where he put over Legality in the Horseman Futurity. V. Fleming's leaders were The Royal Lady, Darkey Hal, and the three year old gelding Captain Andy with which he won at Goshen in 2:03.

Breitenfeld had three winners at Hartford and Goshen, and Childs three at Cleveland. Braden's Heir was Rodman's leader and Pitman won with Nora Scott and Patch Direct as well as May E. Grattan.

Daniels led with the Calumet Farm colts, Calumet Annette scoring in 2:04 and Calumet Brownie in 2:05. Guy Britton was Nat Ray's best pupil. Henry Thomas was at the first three Grand Circuit meetings with Hollywood Jenny, Goldwood and Hollywood Hunter.

Parker's stable. Egan won three events for the Hanover Shoe Farm at Lexington after he scored with his namesake at Indianapolis in 2:05. Hollywood Chief was the leader for Leese. He also won at Goshen with Myra Guy in 2:06. Byroad's four races were won with Ovelmo Lad. Corporal Lee won two of the four credited to Harry Brusie.

Mahoney won on the western end of the circuit with Aquitania, Senator Crawford and Laurel Wreath. Hodson won in the Grand Circuit at Hartford with Peter Patch and at Goshen with Happy the Great and Prince W. He also landed the \$10,000 pace at Syracuse with Harry D.

White won with Bob Galloway, Scotland and McIlvain, and Dickerson with Gray Brewer, Anna Bradford's Boy and Hollywood Colin. The last named scored in the Castleton at Lexington in 2:03.

Miss Woerner won for Walter Cox at Kalamazoo before she was sold for export. He also landed McAubrey and Guy Day at Syracuse. Noon won for Valentine at Toledo while at Indianapolis he came through with Steel late and High Noon in 2:04.

John L. Dodge won three stakes with Hollywood Harrod, his fastest trip behind him being at Goshen. Dick McMahon won two events with Calumet Adam and one with Ross Guy. Fen Sturgeon had three winners at the Toledo meetings. He scored at the first one with Bessie Guy and John D. and came back at the second with Barbara June.
