Downward Trend In Stock Prices Yesterday

NEW YORK, Oct. 25 (AP)—Steels were under selling pressure today in a generally lower stock market.

Prices throughout the list were off by fractions to around 2 points, and steel shares as a group showed the widest decline.

Motors were active but held fairly steady as a whole. Ralls eased without much activity. Chemicals and aircrafts turned mixed while oils and utilities were down.

A mixed opening changed into a retreat before mid-day, but for the remainder of the session, stocks dropped small fractions. The close, however, was better than the lowest points of the day.

Brokers pointed out that today's volume of 1,100,000 shares was considerably under the 1,800,000 shares traded Friday when the market was sharply higher.

At Toronto

TORONTO, Oct. 25 (CP)—All groups dipped downwards today in the heaviest trading on the Toronto Stock Exchange since last Nov. 18. Speculative golds held attention in a weaker list and base metals and western oils sagged slowly.

Nicholson continued in the limelight in golds, trading almost 500,000 shares for a six-cent gain at \$1.05. Early in the session it touched a new high at \$1.23. Hollinger, Lake Shore, Tack Hughes and Bralorne were down in the senior group. Dome added 1-4 at 15 1/4. New Norzone, Athona and Apex were among busier speculatives.

The exchange's closing index showed golds down 82 at 87.29, base metals down 57 at 108.56, western oils down 54 at 45.67.

Golds listed 57 gains, 62 losses, 37 unchanged; base metals, 8 gains, 19 losses, 2 unchanged; western oils, 8 gains, 8 losses, 2 unchanged.

At Montreal

MONTREAL, Oct. 25 (CP)—Selected industrials closed on a much easier tone today during fairly active trading on the Montreal Stock Exchange and Curb Market. Most losses were fractional, but a few issues dropped more than a point. There were several turn-overs of one hour's trading or less. No definite trend was established during active mining transactions.

Industrial sales were approximately 45,100 shares, while mines totalled 285,800 shares.

Closing averages showed banks up .35 at 27.15; utilities up .2 at 75.7; industrials off 1.3 at 134.3; papers off 5.41 and golds off .27 at 60.11.

At London

LONDON, Oct. 25 (Reuters)—The new electricity three-per-cent loan of 1947-77 made its first appearance in the gilt-edged section of the London Stock Exchange today.

A premium of 5-16 point was quietly held despite small selling by the stags. Other gilt-edged prices were occasionally easier.

The tendency in most other sections was a little better. Trading, however, remained small while dealers awaited developments at today's meeting of the Security Council on the Berlin dispute.
