Federated Capital Makes \$910,288

The second annual report of Federated Capital Corporation, covering the year ended April 30, 1929, shows net profits of \$910,288, after all expenses and provision for Federal taxes. This is equal to 18.7 per cent on the average capital employed during the year, and compares with 17 per cent a year ago. Net earnings on the average amount of common stock outstanding equal \$11.48 per share as compared with \$9.82 a year ago, after deducting all market depreciation shown in portfolio, but not taking into account an appreciation of \$765,990 in value of securities owned. If this amount were added, total realized and unrealized earnings would be 34.3 per cent on the average capital. Dividends on the average amount of preferred stock outstanding were earned 5.3 times. Assets behind each \$100 of preferred stock increased from \$142 to \$224.

Surplus increased from \$601,075 a year ago to \$2,120,213 on April 30, 1929. Net worth increased from \$3,797,648 to \$6,616,533. The company owns dividend paying stocks in 272 Canadian banks, compared with 222 a year ago. Forty-nine per cent of the company's funds on April 30 were invested in banks, trust companies, insurance, mortgage and guarantee companies. W. J. Thorold, president, calls attention to the valuing of securities at cost or market whichever is lower.

Federated Capital Corporation, an investment company of the British type, with an international board of directors, is owned by more than 5,000 investors. 5079-5-30-11.
