HIS MAJESTY'S FIRST LEEVE

This Year was Held at St. James Yesterday

Many Notables in Attendance—Canada's Representative Attached to the Japanese Army.

KING'S FIRST LEEVE. LONDON, Feb. 29—(Special)—King Edward held the first levee this year in the Throne Room of St. James Palace at noon. It was unusually largely attended.

THE NOTABLES PRESENT. The Prince of Wales, most members of the Diplomatic Corps, Cabinet Ministers, many members of the Commons and naval officers were present.

CANADA REPRESENTED. OTTAWA, Feb. 29—(Special)—Capt. H. C. Thacker of the Royal Artillery, Quebec, will be sent to represent Canada as an attaché of the Japanese army.

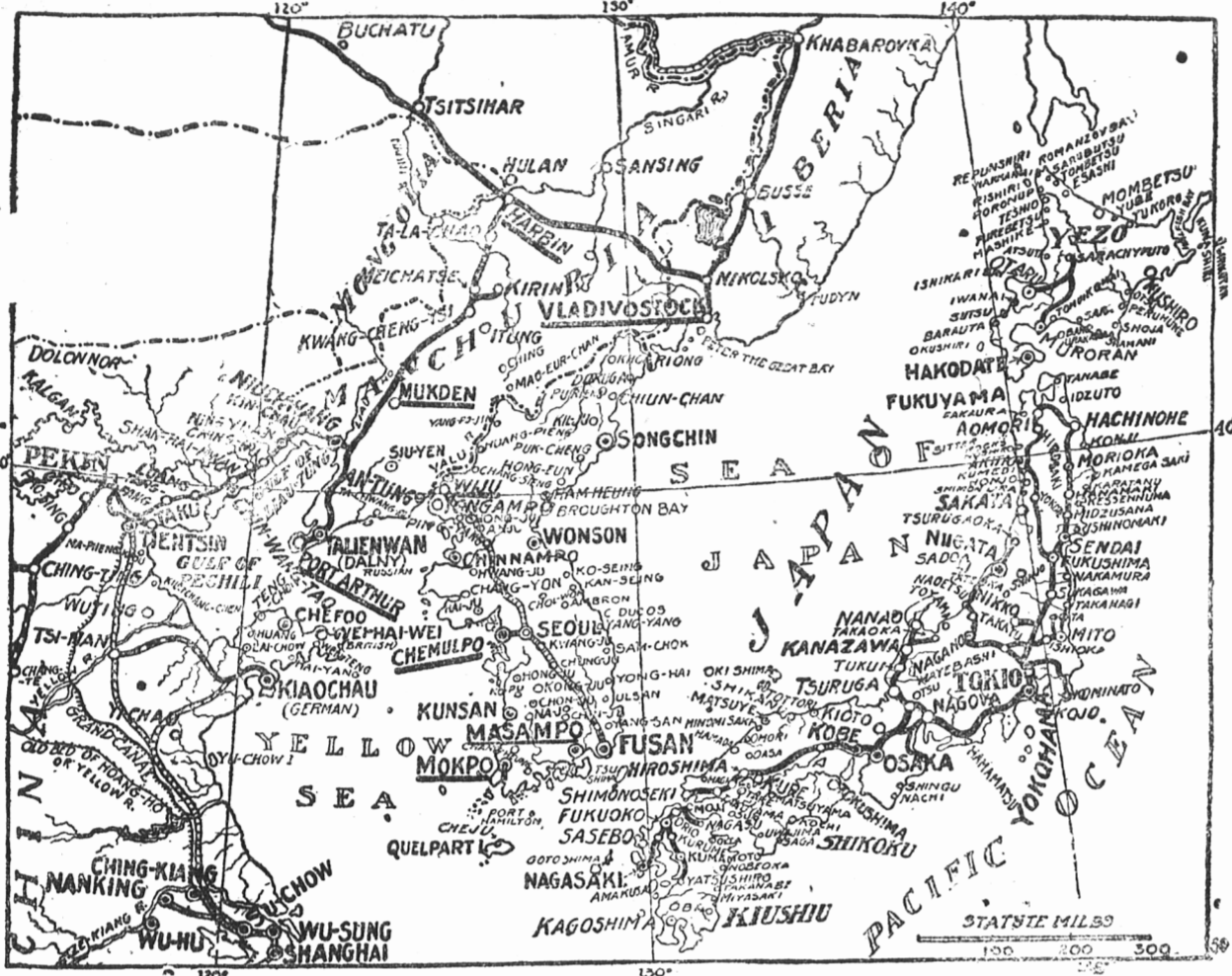

FRENCH WRITER SETS OUT GERMANY'S DARK DESIGN

To Form Coalition Against Britain, Causing Loss to France—Earthquake Shock—The Black Sea Fleet—China Hostile to Russia—Vladivostock Blockaded ---Port Arthur on Siege Rations --- Russian Outrages.

A FRENCH OPINION. PARIS, Feb. 29—(Special).—Paul Deroulede, a Royalist refugee, in an interview declares the French Foreign Minister is doing all possible to prevent a general European conflagration in which France would only burn her fingers to the delight of Germany. GERMAN DESIGNS. He says Emperor William urged Russia to undertake an Asiatic campaign the idea being to coalesce Europe against Great Britain, and if necessary against the United States, and so securing a mono-

poly for German commerce in the destruction of her rivals. FRANCE WOULD SUFFER. In the event of such a war he says the French coast and the French Colonies would be the first sufferers and Premier Delcasse knows this. SLIGHT EARTHQUAKE. A slight earthquake shock was felt here on Sunday morning. BLACK SEA FLEET. Despatches say the Russian Black Sea fleet will proceed to the Far East.

The Russian fleet in the Medi- terranean entered the Suez Canal today. ATTITUDE OF CHINA. Russia regards China as the secret ally of Japan and is taking measures to prevent any sudden attack from that quarter. NO SURRENDER. General Staesselin at Port Arthur in an address to the troops declared they will never surrender. RUSSIAN CRUISER ABROAD. A Russia volunteer cruiser has been reported west of Colombo, Ceylon. STEAMERS RELEASED. Two British, one Dutch coaling steamers captured by Russia and taken to Suez have been released by order of the Czar. VLADIVOSTOCK BLOCKED. Reliable intelligence is received that the Japanese fleet is now blockading Vladivostock. ON SIEGE RATIONS. LONDON, Feb. 29—(Special).—Advices say the Port Arthur garrison are being put on sieg-

rations and all preparations are making for a long struggle. RUSSIAN OUTRAGES. Hundred of Japanese women arrived at Nagasaki from Port Arthur declare that nearly all were outraged by the Russian soldiers while they were detained there. TROOPS AT SEOUL. Advices say that 120,000 Japa- nese troops have landed at Seoul. (Continued on page 8).

CUSTOMS REVENUE STILL BOOMING

On Increase of Three Millions in Nine Months

Mulock Looking After Mexican Trade—Sad Message to Arrested Man—Immigrants from Europe.

CUSTOMS REVENUE BOOMING. OTTAWA, Feb. 29—(Special)—The Customs revenue for the first nine months of the year was \$30,604,012 compared with \$23,434,042 last year, an increase of \$3,169,960. For February the revenue was \$2,975,597 an increase of \$263,330 over 1903.
