#### PRELIMINARY HEARING OF E. J. PERRY

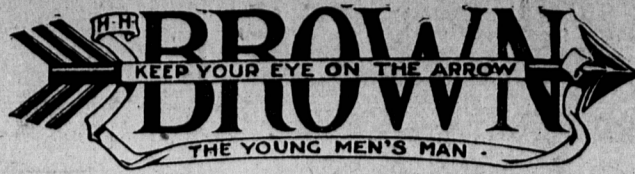
TRURO, Sept 26--The preliminary examination of E. J. Perry, charged with the murder of Mrs Maud Wright at Truro on Sunday, the 18th inst. was begun here today in the County Court House, Stipendiary Magistrate Crowe of Truro, presiding. The Crown was represented by H. O. McLatchy and Gilbert H. Vernon. Looked after the interests of the defendant. No very general interest seemed to be taken in the case. The caretaker of the jail at the East End told how Perry had come there at half past four o'clock on the morning of the 19th, with wound on his throat and wrists, and that Perry explained to him that Maud Wrightman had cut him, and then killed herself.

Dr Eaton testified as to the condition of Perry when he came to his medical office for treatment, also the examination made by him on the body of Maud Wrightman, and the room that she was found dead in. He expressed the opinion that the principal wounds on Mrs Wright's body were not self-inflicted, their positions and characteristics precluded such a probability. The wounds on Perry from their nature were self-inflicted. This concluded the evidence of the day and the enquiry adjourned till Wednesday afternoon.

Higgins, one of those called at the inquest who was regarded as a most important witness, has not been found, and is said to have left for parts unknown. His absence may cause some delay in the early trial of the case, should Perry be committed.
