TIMELY NOTES ON TOPICS CONNECTED WITH Silver Fox Farming



Arthur M. Doyle, one of the leading silver fox and mink ranchers of Western Canada, is paying us a visit. Art was born at Victoria, a student he passed through the Prince of Wales College and taught school for several years, then took up law, made a success of it and went into silver fox farming as a side-line. The All Star Ranch became widely known through the production of prize foxes and good pelts, and from where stocked ranches in various parts of Canada, Europe and California.

With a discerning eye for new fur farming activities, Mr. Doyle was one of the first to realize the possibilities that mink ranching offered, and made his first selection with great care, so it is not to be wondered at that All Star mink are now in a dominating position both as regards prize winning and pelt price returns. Art is thoroughly sold on mink and says that the cost of raising a mink is very much less than silver fox, and believes it is somewhere around 30 and that one man can look after upwards of 1,000 mink. The cost per pen per mink unit is ridiculously small as compared to silver fox pen unit. His pelts realized as high as \$44.00 in 1937 and this season up to \$35.00 after selling a large number of breeders.

This issue of the Fur Trade Journal of Canada completes our fourth year in promoting the business of fur farming. It is interesting to refer to these early issues in 1928, compare prices and conditions then with 1938. B. Graham Rogers carried a full page advertisement for the owner, Dr. J. A. Allen had an article showing the following top auction prices realized for silver fox pelts in 1923: London, \$450. New York \$365, Montreal, \$325.

The Editor might have gone on to say that in the boom time silver foxes sold as high as \$35.00 a pair and pelts as high as \$2,500 each, and that the late Charles Dalton had a pelt for 33 pelts sold at auction in London in 1910.

A letter from the Hudson's Bay Company, London, appears in the Fur Trade Journal addressed to the Editor with the following information: "We have recently received complaints regarding damage to silver fox pelts through the practice of tucking the front legs inside the skins before the pelts are completely dry. When this is done the putrefaction continues and is passed on to the body of the skin as well, giving rise to a milky patch on the back and a similar one to the corresponding front of the belly, and when this type of skin is dressed it not infrequently happens that the top hair and even the wool falls out, the skin as well, giving rise to a course, being correctly treated and the pelts are in perfect order. But we are drawing your attention to this matter because we think it is one of general interest. As this trouble can easily be eliminated over the property you care to pass on the information to your readers, Hudson's Bay Company."

TORONTO, Aug. 12—(CP)—

War rumors were used to shake the stock market down today and although the last hour brought a considerable rally the closing found all group levels well below those of Thursday. Industrial shares recorded the widest declines, some of them ranging from 1 to 3 points. The early action brought a sharp decline in Hard Rock. At the \$2 level heavy buying set in and the price rebounded to 2 1/4. The close at 2 1/4 was off 9 cents for the day. MacLeod-Cockshutt backed off to 3.90 and closed at 3.60, off 15 cents net. Senior golds held firm, only Dome and Lake Shore posting minor losses. The close was off 1/2 cent, and among the cheaper issues Uchi stood out with a net advance of 9 cents. Bralorne lost 20 cents, Central Patricia 10, East Malartic 7, Kerr-Addison 10, O'Brien 10 and Wright-Hargreaves and Sylvanite 10 cents each. International Nickel recovered a point, ending at 1.90. Hudson Bay fell back 3-4. The close smelters had a minor loss, Wabigoon tumbled to 6.30 and recouped to 6.50 for a net loss of 25 cents. Aldermac dropped 22 1/2 cents, Falconbridge 20 and Ventures 10.

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
