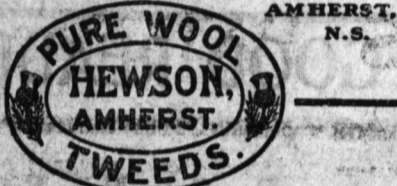

BREACH IS HEALED BETWEEN JAPS AND U.S.

Roosevelt and Schmitz Come to An Agreement—Japanese Children Will Be Admitted to Schools, But Cookies Will Be Barred

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19.—Japanese children are to be admitted to the white schools of San Francisco under certain restrictions: skilled and unskilled laborers coming from Japan are to be barred from the mainland of the United States and American laborers skilled and unskilled are to be excluded from Japan.

This is the basis of the agreement reached between President Roosevelt, Secretary Root, Mayor Schmitz and the San Francisco School Board, as an adjustment of the Anti-Japanese agitation brought about by the segregation of Japanese children in the schools of San Francisco.

The agreement means that the schools of San Francisco will be continued in the same manner as they were before the Board of Education adopted the resolution last October providing for the segregation of the Japanese, except that (1) Japanese who are in the primary grades must continue to attend the Oriental schools and the Japanese children under 15 years of age will be admitted to classes with white children of their grade.

While the resolution of the school board as amended reads: "Children of alien birth" it is freely admitted by Mayor Schmitz and his associates that the resolution will apply only to the Japanese children and the change in the wording was to make it plain to the Tokio Govt. that no discrimination was intended against Japanese children.

The leading newspapers today explained that this action by the United States Government is perfectly legitimate and in accordance with treaty stipulations. FRENCH PLANS FOR WIRELESS

PARIS, Feb. 19.—The Cabinet has approved the recommendations of the Committee of National Defence relative to the organization of wireless stations. The coast and interior stations for commercial purposes will include extra powerful plants at Quessant, Marseilles and Algiers, and ordinary stations at Buloigne-sur-Mer, Havre, St. Nazaire, Nice and Caye Varas.

ENGLAND PLANS FOR THE HAGUE

LONDON, Feb. 19.—Professor de Martens, the Russian Imperial Councillor of State, having upon his arrival in England announced that his conferences with Sir Edward Grey and other leaders would be quite informal, and that the views expressed at these meetings would not be binding on either party, the Foreign Office decided not to make any official announcement on the subject. It can be stated, however, that despite the opposition of the Continental powers Great Britain will continue to press for the inclusion in the program of the Hague Peace Conference the question of the reduction of expenditures on the armies and navies of the world.

DISASTER IN MEXICAN MINE

MONTREY, Mexico, Feb. 19.—A despatch to the News from Las Esperanzas, Coahuila, says that thirty-nine men are known to be dead and twelve injured, as a result of the explosion of gas in the coal mine at that place. The list of dead and injured may be extended to seventy, as that number of men are believed to have been in the mine at the time of the accident, which occurred at three o'clock yesterday afternoon.

The explosion occurred at 3 p.m. in the Conquistador Mine, No. 3. Thirty dead bodies have been taken out of the wreck and it is estimated that seventy five more are yet in the mine.

Las Esperanzas is on the line of the International Railway, about 75 miles from Eagle Pass, Texas. It is the principal coal-mining centre in Mexico, and many men, including a large number of Japanese are employed there.

EXPLOSION IN MEXICAN MINE

LA BESO, Tex. Feb. 19.—Telegrams from Montrey, Mexico, early today, told of a disastrous mine explosion which occurred last night in the La Conquistador mine No. 3 of the Las Esperanzas district in which 30 miners are known to have lost their lives. The dead may be increased to 75 when full details are received. According to message reports the explosion occurred shortly after the night shift had begun work. The explosion is thought to have been caused by gas which ignited from a defective lamp carried by one of the miners. The accident is the most serious that has occurred in the district since the disaster in the Barro Colorado mine a year ago, when nearly 100 lives were lost. A special train with physicians and medical supplies have been despatched to the scene of the explosion, but there is little hope that many have escaped alive.

POPE ANGRY AT DIPLOMATS

Members of Corps Participated in Disgraceful Orgy and Were Found Out

LONDON, Feb. 19.—The Pope has demanded the resignations of several members of the Diplomatic Corps, accredited to the Apostolic See, who took part recently in a disgraceful orgy. The occasion was a farewell banquet in Rome to a secretary of one of the Embassies.

The guests, 30 in number, assembled after midnight at a popular night resort of the capital, and included besides various secretaries and attachés belonging to the Embassies and Legations, accredited to both the Quirinal and the Vatican a number of young aristocrats and actresses. All went merrily until the champagne was brought on, when a certain freedom of demeanor towards a French dancing girl named Pomponette caused her to beat a hurried retreat from the restaurant. Further displays of undiplomatic gallantry towards the actresses, who had been hoisted on the table and peeted with bread-crusts, lumps of sugar, and other projectiles, stirred up resentment on the part of the women, till a Piedmontese artist named Vera Sylvas, smarting from the effects of a handful of salt which had been thrown in her eyes, retaliated by striking one of her aggressors on the head with a water-bottle. The wounded man, who is connected with the Spanish Embassy to the Vatican, fell unconscious to the ground. A free fight ensued; plates, glasses and all the available crockery being used as weapons, as a consequence of which the proprietor's bill for damages alone amount to £112.

Despite all efforts to hush up the incident the police decided upon a public prosecution, and are on the track of the artist Vera Sylvas, who has fled from the city.

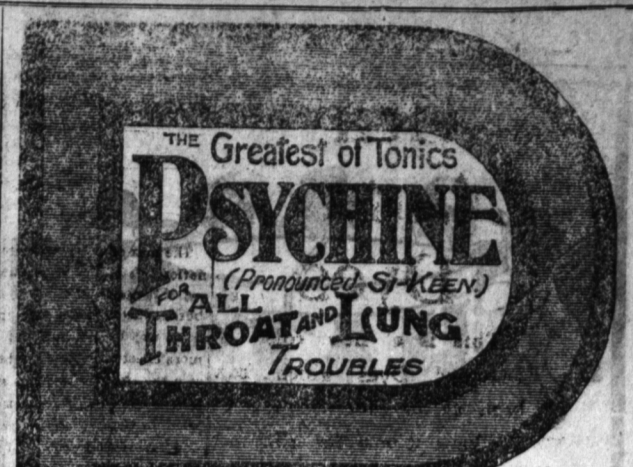
