**KEEPING KNITS SHAPELY**  
To keep knitted garments shapely, they should be laid away in chests or drawers with tissue paper carefully placed between the folds, never hung as other garments on hangers. If you wash and block them yourself, remember they must be handled very carefully when wet. If you send them to a dry cleaner, it's a good idea to write out stretching or shrinking in any special places—and attach them to the garment when you leave it at the cleaning establishment.

**THRIFTY HINT**  
Don't throw away cotton sugar and flour sacks when they are emptied. After washing and hemming, they'll make very efficient dish rags, dusters and even dish towels. Soiling the sacks in soapy water will usually remove the printing. If necessary a little household bleach may be added to the wash water.

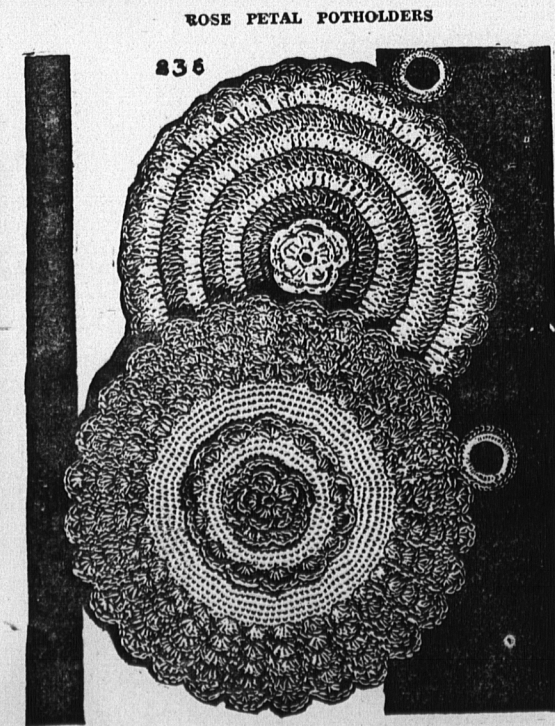

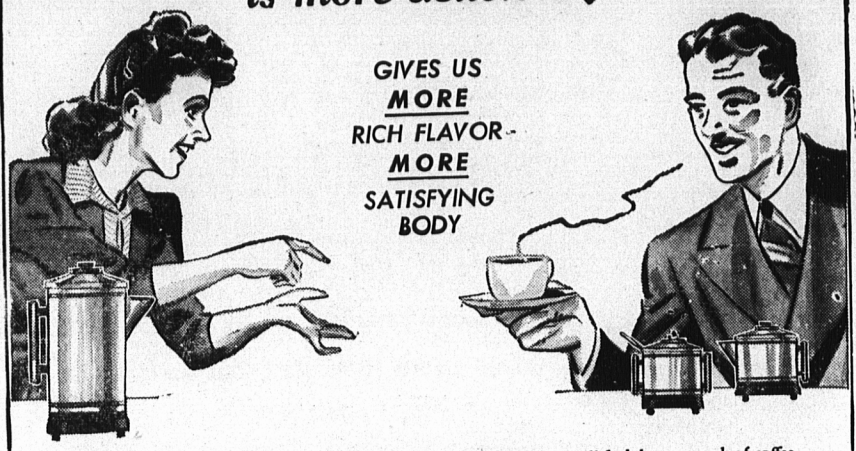

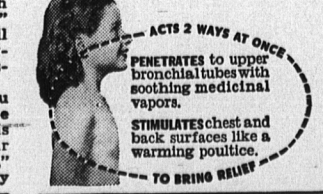
