## Dorothy Dix's Letter Box

### WIFE HAS RIGHT TO KEEP SECRETS FROM HER HUSBAND

#### Don't Go Into Too Much Detail When Discussing Plans, And Don't Burden Your Man With Tales Of The Mistakes You Have Made

Dear Miss Dix—Should a wife have any secrets from her husband? Should she tell him everything she knows or keep matters that are strictly her own private affairs to herself? A BRIDE.



Answer: Certainly a wife has not only a right but also a duty to keep her own secrets. The old charge that women talk too much goes double in the home. Half of the trouble they get themselves into with their husbands is the result of babbling things they should have kept to themselves. A woman, for instance, shouldn't tell a man who is already burdened down with business cares and troubles about her own petty worries. She shouldn't meet her husband at the front door with a list of complaints about how naughty the children have been, that the price of butter's risen, that the doctor says Mary has to have her adenoids out, and that the baby broke his pet pipe.

A wife should maintain a masterly silence upon those subjects which are like a red flag to a mad bull to her husband. It may be politics or religion upon which they differ, but why discuss it when it is sure to bring on a row? She can go on believing that her church is the only church, or that the country will go to the dogs if her candidate is not elected, and still keep peace in the family if she just won't talk about it.

And especially should women keep mum about their own families. The reason so many men dislike "cockers-in-law" is because their wives are always throwing what "Mother said we should do" in their teeth.

Wives make a fatal mistake when they discuss their plans too much. The average husband doesn't really care what his wife does within reason, and when she consults him before and he feels that he has to object to show his authority. But if she just goes along and does it without debating the subject it is all right with him. And anyhow, after a thing is done, it is done, and there isn't any use in protesting.

Wives cut their throats with their husbands about all the mistakes they make. Virtually every man takes his wife at her word and thinks that she is always telling him what a poor manager she is, how she doesn't seem able to get as much out of her allowance as he thinks she does, or how she let the butcher short change her, and that she just doesn't know why her cakes always fall, he says. Money is the one thing that he has a poor makeshift of, a wife who isn't any account and who wastes his money.

But if she is always telling him what a grand bargain she made at a marked-down sale, and how she traded off his old coat for a new tin sauce pan, she seeks to irritate him as a blue ribbon prize winner, and he boasts of her among his friends.

Wise is the woman who chuckles her biscuits into the garbage can and puts the lid down on them when they turn out heavy; who picks her hair, and says nothing about it.

A woman should maintain the silence of the grave about her real opinion of her husband. Let those who do not have to live with him tell him of his faults and point out his shortcomings. Never should she be the one to remind him of his mistakes, or let him know from any word of hers that she regards him otherwise than as an oracle and a spellbinder.

Another secret a woman should keep from her husband is the fact that she is losing her looks and putting on weight. Heaven knows his mercy has ordained that men take their wives for granted and seldom look closely at them, so the chances are that he hasn't noticed it and is still seeing her as she looked the day he married her.

The old proverb says that silence is gold and speech is silver. Every wife should go on the gold standard and keep her own secrets.

## THE COOK'S CORNER

### STRAWBERRY CHESTON PIE

- 1 tablespoon granulated gelatine
- 1 cup cold water
- 1 cup boiling water
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 box strawberries, crushed
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 pint heavy cream
- 1 egg white
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1 baked pie shell

Method: Sprinkle the gelatine over the cold water and let stand for 5 minutes, then add to the boiling water and stir until dissolved. Crush the berries and add the sugar to them, then mix these into the gelatine mixture. Set in a cool place until partially thickened.

Whip the cream until stiff, and beat the egg white until stiff but not dry, and gradually add the 2 tablespoons sugar. First fold the whipped cream into the partially thickened strawberry mixture, then the beaten egg white. Pour the mixture into a baked pie shell and set in the refrigerator to set. Garnish with whipped cream and additional strawberries.

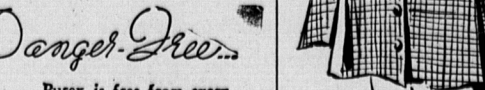
