CAREFUL STORAGE OF GARDEN TOOLS AFFECTS SAVING

Store the garden hose off the ground indoors, so that it will be free from dirt, grit and grease. It should be placed in a cool moist spot. It is advisable, if possible, to coil the hose on a wooden reel in order to prevent bends and kinks from forming.

The metal parts of various garden tools should be greased and the lawn mower oiled. Under no circumstances should these tools be in contact with the hose or any other rubber articles. Grease is "poison" to rubber. Handles that have worn loose should be wedged or screwed back to their original firmness before being stored away.

Keep any leftover or gathered seeds moist and cool, and like left-over supplies of fertilizer, store them where they will be safe from mice and water.

HONEST DOCTOR TELLS WOMAN WHAT TO EXPECT IN WEDLOCK

Trouble With "Keeping Company" Is In Man Abandoning Girl When Beauty Fades

DEAR MISS DIX—I am a 26-year-old school ma'am, but I hate to be one and do not care to be an old maid. I was very popular with the boys until two years ago when I fell in love with a man twenty years older than myself. I was so infatuated with him that I dropped all of my other friends, and saw him several nights a week, as I still do. He told me that he did not want me to lose my time going with him and that he would come to some decision in a short while about whether he wanted to marry me or not. Now he has decided that he will marry me for a wife but only under the conditions that he sets forth:

- (1) If we marry, we will not have any children.
 - (2) I must be his secretary and nurse in his office (he is a physician). If I agree to these points, he will furnish me with a beautiful home, a servant, and everything that is in his power to give me. If I refuse, the marriage is off.
