Earl Grey, which was lying in Pictou Harbor then. The communication was perfect and Mr Taylor told Mr. Cook that the message from the Earl Grey would be 150 miles further. In connection with the opening of the wireless station on the Magdalen it may be worth noting that the Pictou advocate, that the first message came on a Sunday last Spring from the D.G.S. Minto to the Pictou station and was forwarded to Halifax by telephone, that Sunday being the first of the Sunday telephone service. The message was in reference to the health of Mr. Leslie, who had been seriously ill.

SEE UNITED STATES PLUNGED INTO BIG WAR WITH JAPAN.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 16.—Sensations continue to multiply in reference to the suppressed report of Secretary of War Dickenson on the weakness of the nation's defence power, but the greatest developed today when it was stated in official circles that Major General Leonard Wood, Chief of Staff of the Army, is convinced that a conflict with Japan is only a matter of time. It is understood that his belief has raised such a stir in Washington. General Woods believes that sooner or later there will be a clash between the United States and Japan over the struggle for territorial and commercial supremacy in the Far East. The authorities see a great menace to the continued peace relations of the two powers in the questions of the future spheres of influence to be occupied in the Far East. Secretary Dickenson was enlightened on this subject by his trip to the Philippines. It is now understood that his views about Japan coincide with those of General Wood. The two are making desperate efforts to

bolster up the army and strengthen the coast defenses and otherwise prepare the country for what they regard as an inevitable clash.

INDUSTRIAL MEN MAY FOLLOW SUIT

TORONTO, Dec. 16.—It is rumored here today in connection with the farmers' deputation at Ottawa, that there will be a counter demonstration by the industrial interests of the Dominion and their vast army of employees, who will not sacrifice seven or eight hundred millions of dollars without a fight. The industrial demonstration, it is said, will probably overshadow anything of the kind ever organized in Canada.
