WOOD ISLANDS-CARIBOU CAR FERRY SERVICE

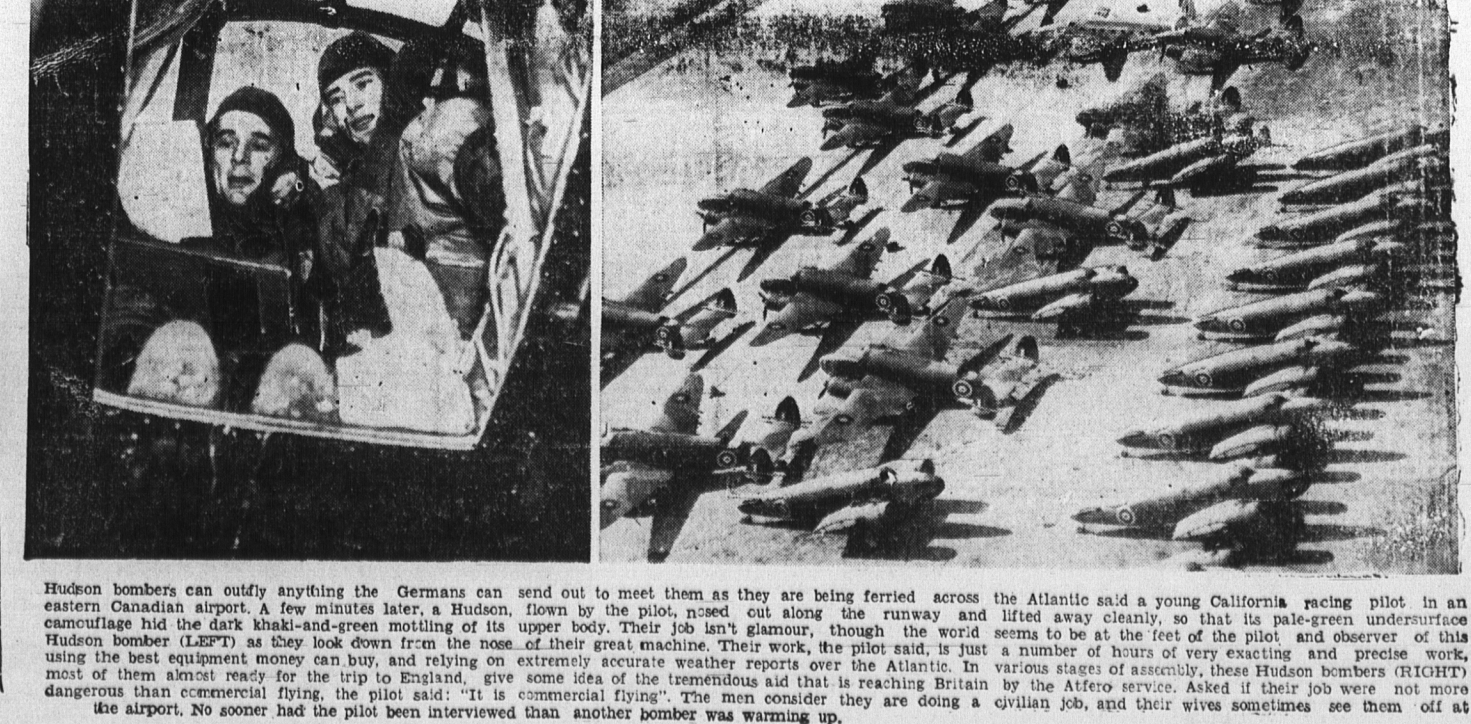

Ferrying Bombers to Britain is Man-Sized Job Hudson bombers can outfly anything the Germans can send out to meet them as they are being ferried across the Atlantic said a young California racing pilot in an eastern Canadian airport. A few minutes later, a Hudson, flown by the pilot, nosed out along the runway and lifted away cleanly, so that its pale-green undersurface camouflage hid the dark khaki-and-green mottling of its upper body. Their job isn't glamorous, though the world seems to be at the feet of the pilot and observer of this using the best equipment money can buy, and relying on extremely accurate weather reports over the Atlantic. In various stages of assembly, these Hudson bombers (RIGHT) are being ferried to the Atterro service. Asked if their job were not more dangerous than commercial flying, the pilot said: "It is commercial flying". The men consider they are doing a civilian job, and their wives sometimes see them off at the airport. No sooner had the pilot been interviewed than another bomber was warming up.
