**Cardinal Voices View of Coughlin**

BOSTON, Dec. 11.—William Cardinal O'Connell, Archbishop of Boston and Dean of the Roman Catholic Hierarchy in America, tonight expressed his views on Rev. Charles E. Coughlin's recently organized National Union for Social Justice.

In reply to a question, Cardinal O'Connell, who celebrates his 76th birthday tomorrow, said: "There can be little doubt that Father Coughlin has a genuine interest in the welfare of the people.

"I do not sit in judgment upon Father Coughlin," he said, "but experience has taught me that in general, clergymen, no matter of what creed, are treading on hazardous ground when they try directly to solve political or economic problems.

"There is a difference between a priest preaching the principles of social justice, and his attempts to apply the principles of social justice through political or other means. No priest has a right to speak for the entire Church, nor commit the Church to his policies.

"It must never be forgotten that there are always two sides to every problem. And we are all privileged to question interpretations of principles of social justice which one individual may make."

Cardinal O'Connell, expressing his personal opinion, declared, "Priests should hold themselves to the high principles of the Church, and the teachings of the great doctrines of the Church."
