### KING WORKS ON UNEMPLOYMENT COMMISSION

#### Plans To Have Commission Completed Previous To Dominion-Provincial Parley.

OTTAWA, Nov. 26.—Completion of the basic details of a National Unemployment Commission a plank in the Liberal Government's program, is understood to be one of the activities engaging the attention of Prime Minister Mackenzie King during his visit to a Georgia seaside resort. He is not expected to return to Ottawa until the end of this week.

When he proceeded to the Georgia Coast after signing the Canada-United States Trade Agreement the Prime Minister said he hoped to get some relaxation and outdoor exercise, but that he would be doing a great deal of work.

Some weeks ago the Premier said it would be the intention of the government to have the Unemployment Commission practically completed before the Dominion-Provincial Conference which opens Dec. 9. The Commission will be patterned somewhat after the Canadian Patriotic Fund Commission. It will be an honorary commission with a salaried executive.

Hon. Ernest Lapointe, Minister of Justice and acting Prime Minister, will preside over a Cabinet Council tomorrow. There will have been no sessions of the government in Council since the middle of last week.

Most of the provinces have presented their suggestions for the agenda of the Dominion-Provincial Conference and it was expected preparations for the meeting between the provincial and federal ministers would be complete within a week.

### Selassie's Troops Strongly Entrenched

DESSAYE, (via Addis Ababa 20,000 radio), Nov. 26.—Ethiopia has 200,000 thoroughly-equipped troops stationed in carefully-hidden camps around this northern defence base. Havas was reliably informed tonight.

DESSAYE is Emperor Haile Selassie's last-ditch stronghold in the path of the Italian advance from the north. The Emperor's generals are making no predictions regarding the Fascists' progress up to this point, but they are determined that beyond Dessaye the Italians shall not pass.

At least 10,000 well-armed soldiers have marched through Dessaye daily for the last few days. Most of the defence force will be kept here to bar the road to Addis Ababa 150 miles to the southwest. Some troops, however, will be sent to the northern front to help stem the Italian tide south of Makale.

### Canadian Sardines Well Known in India

The use of canned salmon and tinned fish is on the increase in India. Canada's share of this trade comes from the Pacific and Atlantic coasts, that, from the Pacific being made up of salmon and from the Atlantic of sardines, according to the Industrial Department of the Canadian National Railways. Japan is the largest source of supply for tinned fish. A few years ago Canadian sardines were little known in India, with the possible exception of Bombay and Calcutta, but today they have spread to other centres.

### Sam Langford Promised Job By N. Y. Mayor

NEW YORK, Nov. 26.—Sam Langford, the Nova Scotian negro who was a terror of the prize ring before punches dimmed his sight, visited Mayor Fiorello LaGuardia today and got the promise of a job.

The old heavyweight recently was seriously injured when he was struck by a taxi in Harlem. While recovering in hospital, Langford received a note from the Mayor asking him to call at City Hall when he was discharged. He did and the Mayor promised to put him to work.

"I don't know what the job will pay," Sam said, "but if it's only \$10 that'll be something. It looks like I'll have to eat pigs feet instead of turkey on Thanksgiving Day, though, for I haven't got a dime."
