Greeks make Gains on Port Valona

ATHENS, Greece, Dec. 29 (AP) - Greek forces were reported today to have edged closer to Valona, their next goal, by threatening Italian control at three points guarding the approaches to that southern Albanian port.

These reports came following a week-end announcement that a Greek submarine, slipped inside a destroyer guard, sank three ships totalling between 25,000 and 30,000 tons from an Italian convoy in the Adriatic.

The submarine, the Papanicolaou, worked in to effective range and let go all her torpedoes despite the supplies in the hold, and then then took six in port despite salvos of depth charges.

Action continued slow Sunday because of heavy snow.

At Tepeleni, Greek machine-guns were trained on the road connecting with Italian bases to the north-west. The Greeks have captured 20 prisoners and a large quantity of supplies in the area.

In the Klisura sector, also a control point on roads in the southern fighting zone, the Greeks have driven the Italians from their most important hill positions to a last line of defence in the valley.

This line was described as only a series of trenches and barbed wire entanglements which, the Greeks said, has been put under heavy gun fire from the captured heights.

One report said the Italians attempted several counter attacks in the Klisura sector but that all were crushed, partly with the help of heavy bombardment of Fascist troops by Greek warplanes.

Along the coast, Greek advances were reported beyond Glinata.

A British Royal Air Force communiqué told of a waterfront raid Saturday by R.A.F. planes on Valona despite "extremely bad weather."

Livestock

MONTREAL, Dec. 30 (CP) - The Dominion Livestock Branch reported today that cattle were draggy and prices barely steady on the two Montreal markets.

Lambs were a shade easier, medium \$6.75 to \$8, and common \$5 to \$6.75. Heifers 34 to 7. Good cows were \$5.50 to \$5.75, medium \$4.50 to \$5.25, and common \$3.75 to \$4.50. Canners and cutters were mostly \$3 to \$3.50. Bulls ranged from \$3.75 to \$6. Good bulls were \$5 to \$6, common mostly \$4 to \$4.50.

Calves were steady, quality considered. Good quality veals were \$11.50 to \$12. Medium kind \$10.50 to \$11 and common light veals down to \$9. Drinkers were \$5.50 to \$8.50. Grassers were \$4.50 to \$5, averaging close to \$4.75.

Lambs were steady to a shade easier. When graded, good ewes and wethers were \$10. The bulk of the lambs were bucks and were close on a flat basis at \$8.75 to \$9. Common lambs or ewes were picked out at \$7. Sheep were \$8 to \$9, mostly \$4.50 to \$5.

Hogs were unchanged at \$11.35 for B-1 dressed, \$9.50 for B-1 alive and watered. Grade "A" drew \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Sows were \$5.50 to \$6.50.

NEW YORK, Dec. 30 (AP) - The stock market extended its year-old recovery today as tax-selling waned and sold-out customers reinstated some of their commitments.

Gains ranged from fractions to around two points, although top marks were cut in many instances at the close. Issues with a war flavor were most prominent on the upside but virtually all departments participated in the recovery.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks held a net advance of .4 of a point at 43.8. Transfers totalled 1,179,277 against 1,272,710 last Friday.

In the advancing column were U.S. Steel, Bethlehem, Dow Chemical, Westinghouse, John-Manville, Eastman Kodak, American Can, Air Reduction, Kennecott, Union Pacific, Santa Fe, N. Y. Central, Chrysler, Yellow Truck, Sears Roebuck, Montgomery Ward, J. I. Case, Douglas Aircraft and Consolidated Edison.

American Sugar refined was up 1 1-2 and the preferred 3 3-4 when the company declared a 50-cent dividend on the common. The previous payment was 25 cents in July, 1938.
