There is fully double the work in postoffices now there was ten years ago and the cost of living is nearly double while the salary remains nearly the same. Here I am I with hundreds of other Post Masters working over 300 days in the year and at the end of every three months they hand me the miserable pittance of six dollars 25c, and mockingly inform me there is a big surplus. Well, in the course of nature anyway I will soon drop out of this office and I feel fully assured there is not one in the district will take it again at less than fifty dollars. CREE CHIEFS PLACED ON TRIAL

To Answer to the Charge of Strangling a Little Girl.

HUDSONS BAY, August 10.—Today began the trial of two Cree chiefs for murder. It is the result of a determined effort by the Canadian government to put a stop to the savage tradition that all members of the tribe stricken with delirium in fever are possessed of an evil spirit, or windigo, and must be killed at once, or their souls will be lost. John and Joe Paquequan, heads of the Cree nation, deliberately strangled the girl, daughter-in-law of one of them, with all tribal formalities prescribed on such an occasion, in the presence of several hundred Indians. The tribe have murdered twenty Indians in a similar way. The girl had fever and they strangled her with a rope.

MR. CARNEGIE GIVES \$500,000

For Use unconditionally by the King Edward Hospital in London.

LONDON, August 10.—Andrew Carnegie has deposited in the Bank of England \$500,000 as a contribution to the King Edward hospital fund. The donation is unconditional, but Mr. Carnegie expressed the desire that the money be spent as seems best, adding that the more strenuously it is used for reform the better for all concerned.

EMMERSON WANTS HIS PORTFOLIO

OTTAWA, August 10.—In response to an invitation from Sir Wilfrid to his New Brunswick supporters in parliament, five members out of the seven, and one senator have put in an appearance. Rufus Rostigouche is expected, and Emerson is said to have made a fleeting visit to the capital. Sir Wilfrid has seen the five, one by one, and asked their advice about the New Brunswick portfolio. He has not received much help from these interviews. Emerson desires to be restored to office, and will not recommend anyone else. Carvell is for himself, and has no second choice, except that he prefers Turgeon to Rostigouche. Turgeon is also an aspirant and claims the support of LeBlanc. In his absence Reid is claimed for Turgeon.

synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 17, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section acre, more or less.

Entry must be made, personally at the local office for the district in which the land is situated.

The homesteader is required to perform the conditions annexed therewith under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) If the father for mother, if the father is deceased of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

Six months' notice in writing should be given the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for patent.
