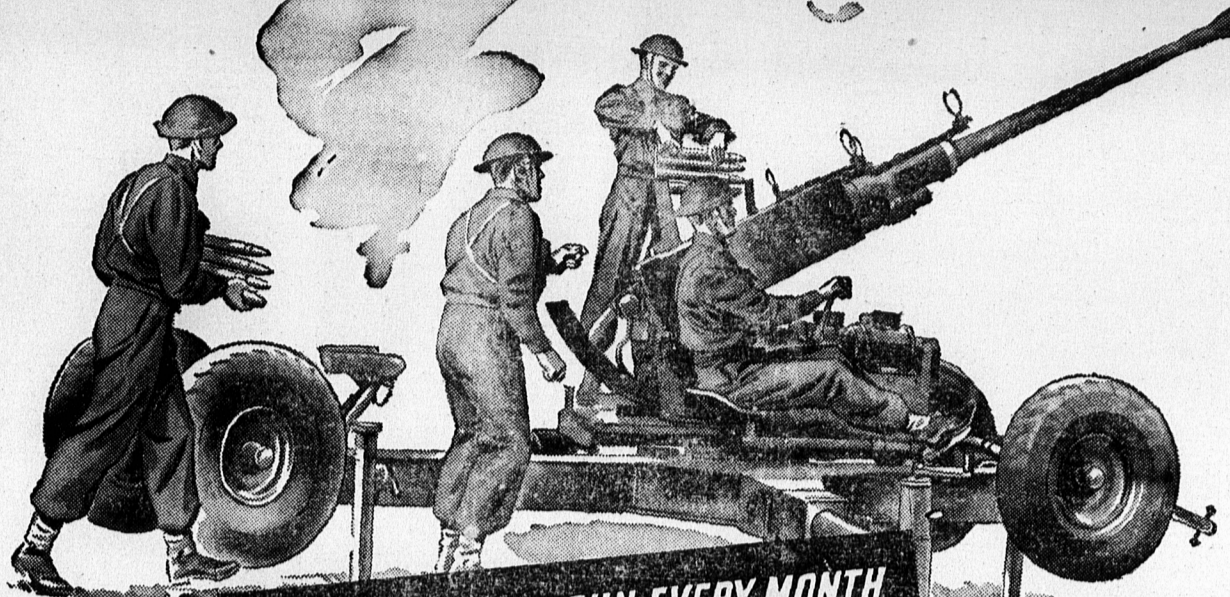
Expect 'flu Epidemic This winter

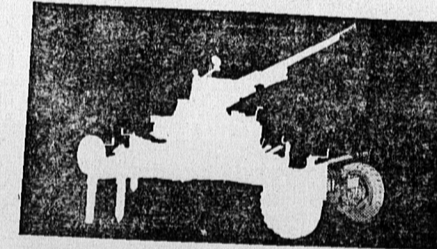
