Bishop Kelly Honoured By Spanish Gov't

MADRID, Nov. 25.—The Spanish Government has awarded to Bishop Francis C. Kelly of Oklahoma City and Tulsa, the decoration of the Catholic Grand Cross of Isabel I. It has been announced here.

The decree which announced the award in the official government bulletin did not set forth, officially, the reasons for bestowal of the honor. However, it was stated unofficially that the award was made by the government in recognition of Bishop Kelly's writings regarding priests who were slain during the Spanish civil war—Exch.

SOY FLOUR FOR BEES

Soybean flour is being tried in Australia to feed bees which would otherwise starve during periods of drought, the Australian News reports. Recent droughts in New South Wales attacked the main source of food for bees—the flowering gums and the ground flora. Many Australian flowers provide copious quantities of nectar, but not sufficient pollen for feeding the young bees which grow very quickly and need large supplies of food.

As a stop gap, soybean flour in which the fat content has been reduced five per cent and mixed to a dough with sugar or honey is being given the growing bee broods as a substitute for pollen in the expectation that the flour will prove a valuable expedient in the bee industry.

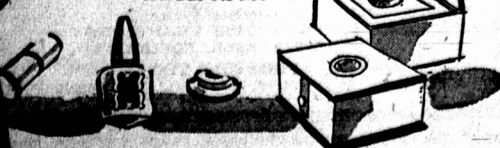
