 NEW YORK, Dec. 29—(AP)—The
 stock market today put on another
 selective recovery move despite the
 handicap of heated tax selling.
 Offerings for establishment of in-
 come losses came but in larger vol-
 ume than in the preceding session,
 but reinvestment demand, brokers
 said, aided many issues to weather
 the squall. While numerous stocks
 were at Thursday's final levels or
 down a shade, advances of frac-
 tions to more than a point predom-
 inated.
 The Associated Press average of
 60 issues was up 8 of a point at 81.1
 on top of an uptick of 4 the day
 before. Transfers of 1,136,361 shares
 compared with 1,090,680 yesterday.
 Among prominent gainers were
 Sears Roebuck, Du Pont, Dow
 Chemical, Eastman Kodak, Amer-
 ican Telephone, American Airlines,
 North American, American Can and
 Chesapeake & Ohio.
 General Motors was up a shade
 and Chrysler off a trifle. U. S.
 Steel showed a slight loss and Beth-
 lehem was up a small amount.
 Gains and losses were about e-
 qually divided among Canadian is-
 sues. Gainers included Distillers
 Seagram, McAlpine, Imperial Oil
 and Lake Shore. Fractions lower
 were Dome, International Nickel,
 Bell Telephone, Ford and Hollinger.
