CANADA'S RECRUITS IN WAR'S SECOND YEAR

OTTAWA, January 6.—During the year just closed 178,537 men were recruited in Canada, or nearly half the total of 385,856 since the outbreak of war. In the last fortnight, 2,517 men enrolled, a decrease of 700 in comparison with the preceding two weeks. Figures by military districts since the war began are:
