Story Of Goering's Visit To Rome Told In Madrid

MADRID, Aug. 4 (AP) - Reichsmarshal Herman Goering went to Rome last week, it was reported.

Goering had a long talk with the King and Badoglio in the Royal Palace Estate which he was accorded full military honors by German and Italian regular army units.

The subject of his talk was not known although reports were that Goering asked for Mussolini on the ground that his life was in danger.

Goering had a long talk with the King and Badoglio in the Royal Palace Estate which he was accorded full military honors by German and Italian regular army units.

The results of the conversation were strictly in the realm of officialdom, but reports are that Badoglio's answer to the request for Mussolini was that it was for the King to decide.

Goering's insistence, the King still said, no adding that he had no intention of handing over the Duce to a belligerent power which might conceivably use him against the King's own idea of what was best for Italy.

After Goering left Rome, Badoglio, at the King's orders, separated Mussolini moving under guard from one Royal property to another.

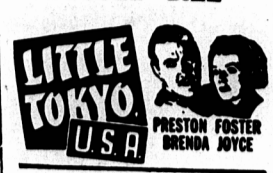
