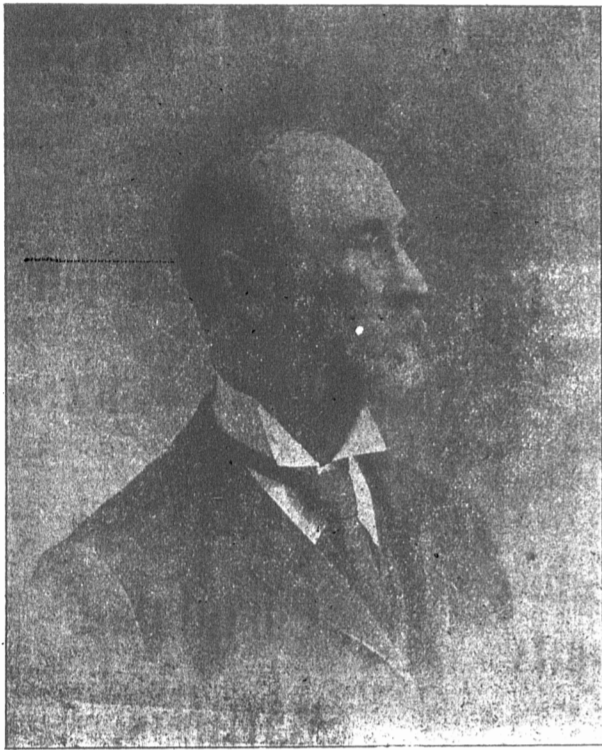

RUSSIAN AND JAP SCOUTS ENGAGED

Strength of Japanese Forces Now Landed in Korea

German Press Opinions—Prominent Japs Reach United States—Russia and Persia—Little Damage by Shells.

SCOUTS BECOME ENGAGED.

SEOUL, March 12.—(Special)—An engagement took place on the 8th between Russian and Japanese cavalry scouts near Kassan.

One Japanese trooper was killed and the Russians eventually retired.

JAPANESE NOTABLES ARRIVE.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 12.—(Special)—Baron Keneko, the former Japanese Minister of Agriculture and Commerce and Takashi, Vice President of the Yokohama Speciebank have arrived here.
