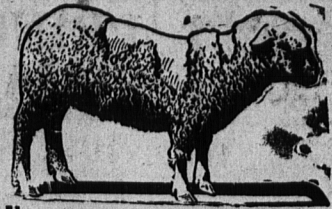

**CAPTAIN NEWMAN.**—Capt. J. E. Newman, formerly in charge of the D. C. O's steamer Cacouna, plying between Halifax and Louisburg, and well known in Charlottetown, has been appointed in command of the steamer A. C. Jacques, which is to ply in the Atlantic trade. Capt. Newman has lately been in command of the steamer Eskasonic, in the West Indies trade.

**A BUSINESS TRIP.**—Mr. W. G. Leslie, of Wm. Leslie & Co. leaves Halifax this morning on the Halifax Chronicle of the 16th, on a visit to Kensington, P. E. I., to call on his brother. From there he will proceed to the Magdalen Islands, where he has been engaged in business the past 45 years. On his return he will pass by Cape Breton, where the steamer Magdalen is engaged. Mr. Leslie hopes to be back in the city in two weeks' time.

**ASHORE IN FOG.**—The chartered Cunard liner, Cheltonian, which was recently damaged by running ashore in a fog on Prince Edward Island, has been temporarily repaired at Sydney and arrived at Halifax late Monday night. She will discharge part of her cargo there and enter the dry dock as soon as the Eastington vacates it. S. M. Brookfield has the contract to repair the Cheltonian, says a Halifax paper.

**MARINE INQUIRIES.**—Captain Demers, Dominion Wreck Commissioner, was expected to arrive in the city Tuesday night says a Halifax paper. The inquiry into the cause of the stranding near Chebucto Head on the morning of Tuesday, June 8th, of the Plant liner A. W. Perry. The inquiry will be conducted in the Customs House Building. Early next week Captain Demers will hold here the inquiry into the affair of the steamer Cheltonian which went ashore on the Newfoundland coast and was beached at North Sydney and later brought to Halifax to go into the dry dock.

**PRETTY WEDDING.**—One of the prettiest weddings of the season was celebrated at the church of the Sacred Heart Monday morning, when John W. Power, eldest son of the late Walter Power, and Miss Josephine Buote, daughter of the late Dominic Buote, were united in the bonds of matrimony, says the Sydney Record. The ceremony took place shortly after six o'clock, and was performed by the Rev. D. MacAdam. The bride looked very pretty attired in a most becoming travelling suit of blue, with black hat with white plumes, and carried a beautiful bouquet of white roses. She was attended by Miss Gerlie Gillis, who wore a blue suit and black hat, and carried pink roses. The groom was supported by his brother William Power. A very large number of wedding presents were received by the bride from her host of friends in the city with whom she is very popular. Mr. and Mrs. Power left on the morning express on a short wedding trip to Prince Edward Island.

**KNOWN IN P. E. I.**—There is genuine sorrow in Richmond at the death of Rev. John F. Duxan, whose memory was honored with a memorial service in the Grove church at which Rev. C. J. Crowdie, who succeeded Mr. Duxan in the pastorate, paid a fine and earnest, although brief, tribute to his character, and Principal MacKinnon, knew him well, delivered an address which will not soon be forgotten by those present, says the Halifax Herald. Mr. Duxan, when attending college in Edinburgh, was much at the house of Dr. MacKinnon's father, whom he accompanied when the latter came out from Scotland to take up mission work in Prince Edward Island. Rarely has the principal of Pine Hill been heard in more eloquent pleading for the highest things than on this evening when all were met in the shadow of a common sorrow, a common loss. He designated the things which individualized Mr. Duxan's preaching as the centrality of the Bible and the evangelistic note, and urged the people to accept the message so faithfully delivered to them. The music was appropriate to the character of the service and included two special selections by the choir and a beautiful solo by Miss Hendry. "Now the laborer's task is over."

OTTAWA, June 16.—The Canadian division at the front would all like to get Canadian boots, according to Captain George Rogers, of the 4th battalion, who is invalided home and called on General Hughes today.

"When we left Salisbury Plain," said Captain Rogers, "we discarded our Canadian boots and were served out with British boots. They were

very heavy and the Canadians, not accustomed to such footwear, soon had their feet slashed to pieces tramping over the cobblestone roads—I have seen half of our regiment disabled with sore feet.

"Some of the boys smuggled across with them their Canadian boots and used them every time they were marching. I had a pair of Canadian boots and I had them stolen on me three times. However they had a peculiar twist to them and I just watch-

ed the boys marching by and soon got back my boots. I wouldn't have taken any money for my Canadian boots and those of us who had footwear from Canada were the envy of the battalion.

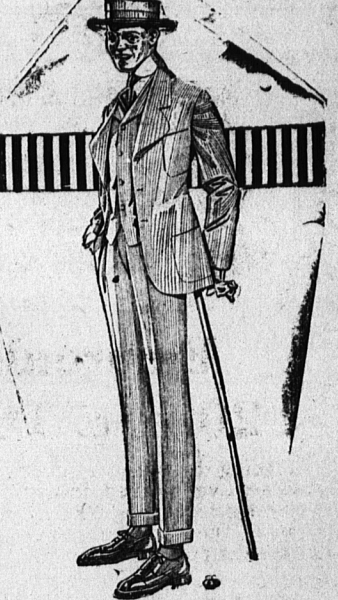
