#### CROP REPORT.

The weather during the month of May was unsettled, cold and backward, with much light rain and mist but scant precipitation. Light frosts were frequent through the month and on the 19th, a heavy thunder shower swept over the western part of the Province. Growth was very slow. Hoar frost occurred on the first of June; very heavy rain on the 2nd, 4th, and 6th, and light showers on the 7th, 8th, and 9th. Since the first of June conditions for rapid growth have been very favourable.

**HAY.** The present prospect for the hay crop in King's County is above average, in general the clover has come through the winter in good condition; in Queens good; a few correspondents report excellent and three very poor; in Prince only fair, particularly West of Summerside, where the clover has been badly killed.

**GRAIN.**—There is nothing unusual in seedling conditions except the cold and backward weather. In a few sections very little wheat has been sown on account of the deprivations of the Joint Worm in former years. There is also a slight increase reported in the acreage sown for summer feeding.

**HOED CROPS.** The acreage sown to turnips is about the same as in

former years. Corn and mangels are not popular crops, but a lot of farmers seem to be planting larger fields of potatoes.

**BALED HAY** of good quality is scarce. Oats is fairly plentiful and there is an abundance of Potatoes still for sale although they are being fed liberally to all classes of live stock.

**CATTLE** have gone on the grass in about the usual condition although a large number of correspondents report that they have been turned out their lack of condition to the poor quality of hay, which was more or less spoiled in the making by the heavy rains of July and August.

There has been some irregularity in the lamb crop. Some have had excellent results, and others the opposite. One correspondent writes "We have saved 100 per cent of our lambs for the first time in 13 years all on account of giving the sheep good care during the winter."

Another says "The sheep in this District have averaged nearly a lamb and a half each and all large and strong." Still another reports lambs as being very scarce.

The milk supply is about the same as last year but nearly all the correspondents report an increase in egg production.

Correspondents report considerable interest being taken in and quite a lot of preparations being made for the Live Stock Judging Classes to be held in June and July. They also state that there will be a large number of entries in the Fields of Standing Grain Competitions this year.

#### SHEEP DIPPING.

The Department of Agriculture, both Local and Federal have for the last few years been giving special encouragement to the sheep industry. Two very excellent pamphlets were printed and distributed throughout Canada, one called "Sheep Husbandry in Canada" the other "The Report of the Sheep Commission." This work is to be followed up at once in this Province by Sheep Dipping demonstrations. Modern dipping equipments such as is described on pages 56 and 57 of "Sheep Husbandry in Canada" have been procured, and sheep will be dipped free of charge to farmers at central points throughout the Province. This week Mr. W. J. Reid, B. S. A., assisted by Mr. Walter Shum have been conducting demonstrations in Lot 16. It is expected they will go to Wilmot Valley for Thursday. As it costs considerable to move the outfit and set ready for dipping it is expected that farmers will drive their sheep some little distance in order that the most good may be accomplished. These settlements will be first visited which can offer the largest number of sheep at central points. There should be at least two hundred sheep dipped at every place the outfit is set. Settlements wishing to have these dipping demonstrations should communicate at once with the Department of Agriculture at Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island.
