THE PRINCE COUNTY GUARDIAN

Offices in Summerside, J. Frank Lafferty, Manager, and in Alberton, Herbert Clark, Manager

—The latest news, first of all.

—John Sark, who has been attending St. Dunstan's College, has returned to Lennox Island.

—Do not forget the ice-cream social to be held in the Court House, Alberton, on Thursday, June 10th, under the auspices of the L. A. S., of the Presbyterian Church. A choice program will be given.

—Considerable excitement was caused near the Railway Freight House by an ox belonging to one of the local butchers, becoming suddenly mad. Efforts to drive it along, were unavailing and the animal had to be killed.

—At the regular meeting of Court Chatauguay, I.O.O.F., Summerside, held on Friday night last, the following were elected as delegates to the High Court—John Grady, Hon. Joseph Read, J. D. Goss, John Molison and Nelson Alward.

—Where were the police a few nights ago when they did not discover a rope running across the water street?

—A new trading port has been opened up by the steamer Acadia, belonging to the Port Elgin Trading Co. which arrived in Summerside on Saturday afternoon with several passengers and considerable freight and left again at eight o'clock yesterday morning on return to Port Elgin, taking a full load of produce, and other goods. It is the intention of the owners to have this boat come to Summerside every Saturday during the summer bringing passengers and freight, and to leave again on return on Monday morning.

—The Railway Commission, with their party, accompanied by Superintendent Sharp, Messrs. Huggan, Pottle, Hodgson, Macdonald and Patience, of the P. E. I. R. Charlottetown, J. W. Richards, M. P., and A. B. Warburton, M. P. arrived in Summerside by special train in charge of Conductor Stearn, about one o'clock yesterday and after lunching at the Office House, proceeded through to Tignish, returning to Summerside about eight p.m., and at 9 o'clock the Commission met the members of the Board of Trade, and Town Council in the Council Chamber, Mayor Saunders in the chair.

The first matter brought to their attention, was the taking of water by the railway from the town supply. This matter will receive their attention this morning. The next matter brought to their attention was that of better shipping facilities on the railway wharf. A plan of the railway property, with the proposed changes as outlined by the Board of Trade was shown to the Commissioners, and discussed by them and several of the citizens. The question of the new station at Summerside was also brought up during this discussion, but from the remarks of Commissioner Butler this matter is not likely to receive much attention for some years. During the discussion, which was taken part in by A. D. Bell, Neil McQuarrie, Dr. MacLellan, President Stewart of the Board of Trade, J. A. Brace and others, several demands were made of the Commissioners as follows: That the winter freight rates via Cape Tormentine to Montreal and points west, and to Sydney and points east, be made the same as the summer route by way of Point Du Chene and Picton. That the Commissioners do their best to arrange with the N. B. and P. E. I. Railways for a through rate, during the time the Cape route is in operation. That more recognition of Summerside, as the chief shipping point of the Island be given in the Time Tables, and literature, distributed by the I. C. R. and P. E. I. Railways. Mr. Stewart in his remarks drew the attention of the Commissioners to the slow manner with which local freight is moved from Summerside to points east of Emerald. In answer to this complaint Supt. Sharpe said he would look into it and do his best to have it remedied. This morning the commissioners with a committee of the citizens will take up more fully the questions brought up by the citizens at a meeting last night.

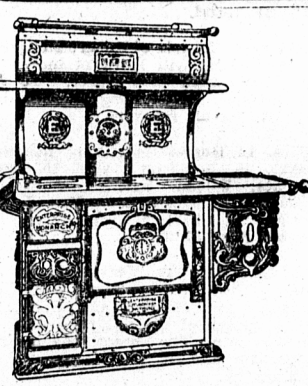
