BANON MORNING LETTER
 Stocks in New York crept fractionally higher, while the ability of the rails to hold above the extreme low of 56.61 is very encouraging. A market increase in volume must occur before the list in general is in a position to move forward on an important scale.
 Reactions may be used for adding to present positions in Automobiles, General Electric, General Motors, Kennecott, Inspiration Copper, Montgomery Ward, Pure Oil Co. American Rolling Mills, Republic Steel, and Simmons and Co.

In the Canadian division, Paper stocks were the star performers of the day, moving up sharply on very heavy trading. Fraser Votting Trust recommended in recent weeks from 34-36 upwards rose to high of 45 7-8. Probabilities favor an early swing to the 48-50 level. Buy on minor dips. Papers still in a buying range include St. Lawrence Preferred, Howard Smith, Consolidated Paper Company and Price Bros.
 Brazil's dip to 24 3-8 yesterday does not alter its prospects of further advance. Buy at the current level. Canada Car and Foundry Common, recommended lower down, ran up to a close of 17. Still a buy.
 In Home Oil, a mark up to 215 was followed by a dip to 195 where an additional commitment may be considered.
 Golds sold off a little further yesterday. In this division, probabilities favor continuation of a trading area. Reactions may be used for picking up East Malartic, Francoeur, Stadacona, O'Brien, Sladen Malartic and Moneta.

INDIANAPOLIS, May 28—Two men died in accidents at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway today as drivers performed at dizzy speeds in tests for Monday's 500 mile race.
 Two crackups resulted in the two deaths and the injury of five persons.
 George Warford 37, of Indianapolis, standing with a pit crew, and Albert O. Alko, a mechanic of Gary, Ind., were the two killed.
 Warford met death as a car driven by Overton Phillips of Los Angeles burst into flames and ran into a pit.
 The blazing car collided with another machine being prepared by Vern Orendorf for a speed test, set this machine afire and both were destroyed.

Divorce Bill Goes To House Of Lords
 (C. P. By Guardian's Special Wire)
LONDON, May 28—Passed on third reading in the House of Commons by a vote of 190 to 37, the Marriage Bill, sponsored by A. P. Herbert, well known humorist, was sent to the House of Lords today. A majority of the members abstained from voting.
 The bill providing for easier divorce is the first such measure to reach this advanced stage since a royal commission recommended relaxation of the divorce laws 27 years ago. Considerably altered in committee, it is expected to undergo further modification in the Upper House if it is not thrown out entirely.
 Under the present law adultery is the sole ground for divorce. The new marriage bill provides for divorce for adultery, desertion, cruelty or incurable insanity, but stipulates that no divorce shall be obtainable in any case within five years of marriage. In addition the bill sets up new grounds for the nullity of marriage and provides for presumption of death in cases of missing parties to a marriage.
